




Dr. Wayne Bowman





Having performed with the groups of trumpeters Ted Curson and Chet Baker, the Thad Jones/Mel Lewis Jazz Orchestra and the Stan Getz Quartet, Jim is currently performing with the Phil Woods Quintet. As well, he leads his own trio and freelances with greats such as Joe Henderson and David Liebman. Jim appears as soloist at concerts and festivals all over the world and has appeared on numerous recordings led by major artists. He currently has eight albums under his own name. Jim is part of the jazz faculty at New York University and is regularly involved in summer workshops such as the Stanford Jazz Workshop and Jamey Aebersold's Summer Jazz Clinics. He is also a composer/arranger for large jazz bands.

#### **ADJUDICATORS & CLINICIANS**



#### Tom Ferguson (piano)

Tom resides in Las Vegas where he frequently plays on the National Public Radio program "Jazz from the Four Queens". He has performed with many great jazz artists including Zoot Simms, Joe Henderson, Joe Farrell, Carl Fontana, Clark Terry, Chet Baker, Joe Williams, and more. His own groups, The Tom Ferguson Trio and The Las Vegas

All-Star Jazz Band have also performed on this National Public Radio program. Tom has done extensive touring in the U.S., Canada, Europe, Australia, and Saudi Arabia and is currently performing nightly at the Las Vegas Hilton Hotel with his new trio, The Jazz Barons.



#### **Butch Miles** (drums)

The accomplishments of drummer Butch Miles are practically endless. He has played for such luminaries as Count Basie, Frank Sinatra, Sammy Davis Jr., Dave Brubeck, Mel Torme, Lena Horne, Joe Williams, Ella Fitzgerald, Woody Herman, Clark Terry, Harry

"Sweets" Edison, Benny Goodman, Dick Hyman, and many others. He has performed at practically every major jazz festival in the world, along with many tours throughout western Europe, the Far East, Asia, North and Central America, and the Caribbean. A noted clinician, Butch has given drum clinics worldwide and has made appearances on international radio and television shows and in two motion pictures. He does extensive studio work and can be heard on many recordings.



#### Skip Beckwith (bass)

Skip has performed worldwide with a countless number of international stars including such jazz greats as Dave Brubeck, Maynard Ferguson, Toshiko Akyoshi, Oscar Peterson, Phil Nimmons, Chick Corea, Moe Koffman, Ed Bickert, Rob McConnell, Oliver

Jones, and many others. He was music director and band leader for Anne Murray and was audio consultant on 12 Anne Murray albums which won 5 Junos, 3 Grammys and 1 Gold Record. Skip performs regularly for radio and television, and can be heard on many recordings. Besides his studio work, he is also very active as a teacher, lecturer, arranger, composer, and producer. Skip is presently on faculty at St. Francis Xavier University and is the founding member of JazFX, the only performing faculty jazz group in Canada.



#### Larry McClellan (trombone)

Larry is Chairman of the Professional Education Division at Berklee College of Music in Boston and holds a Ph. D. from Michigan State University. He has performed with numerous artists including Patti LaBelle, Glen Campbell, Nancy Wilson, Cab Calloway, Melba Moore and Terence Blanchard. He is currently a member of Larry Ridley's

Jazz Legacy Ensemble. He has written jazz trombone transcriptions for Down Beat and the Jazz Educators Journal and is very active as an adjudicator.



#### Willie Hill (saxophone)

Willie is currently an Associate Professor in Music Education and the Assistant Dean, College of Music, at the University of Colorado in Boulder. He is a member of the Denver Broncos Jazz Ensemble and performs regularly as guest soloist with numerous Jazz Ensembles in the Denver/Metro area. He is a freelance performer with the Denver

Symphony Orchestra, and has also performed with George Burns, Liza Minelli, Lena Horn, Lou Rawls, Sammy Davis Jr., Dizzy Gillespie, and many others. Willie is a faculty member of the Clark Terry Great Plains Jazz Camp, and is founder and co-director of the Rich Matteson-Telluride Jazz Academy. He is a national artist/clinician for Yamaha Musical Instrument Co., past president of the International Association of Jazz Educators, Chairman of Multicultural Awareness for the State of Colorado, and a member of the Jazz Fellowships Panel for the National Endowment for the Arts in Washington, D.C. He is listed in Who's Who Among Black Americans and Who's Who Among International Musicians and has won awards for his "Outstanding Service to Jazz Education".



#### **Bob Montgomery** (trumpet)

Bob is a respected performing artist and educator, having appeared as soloist, clinician or adjudicator at Jazz Festivals across the U.S., Europe, and Australia. He has performed in back-up orchestras for such artists as Sammy Davis Jr., Diana Ross, Chuck Mangione, Bob Hope, Tony Bennett, Quincy Jones, The Pointer Sisters, Mel Torme,

Lou Rawls, Clark Terry, and many more. Among his award-winning achievements as an educator, Bob is founder and director of Clark Terry's All American Jazz Camp in Edmond, Oklahoma and Rich Matteson's Mile High Jazz Camp in Boulder, Colorado. Bob is currently Director of the Jazz Studies Program at the University of Denver.



#### Rejean Marois (vocal jazz)

Rejean teaches at Capilano College for the Degree in Jazz Studies and conducts two vocal jazz ensembles: NiteCap and Capital Jazz. He also teaches jazz pedagogy and composition and directs a stage band, concert choir, and chamber choir. He is in demand all over Canada and the U.S. as a clinician and adjudicator and is active as a composer,

arranger, publisher, trombonist, vocalist, and educator. Rejean was nominated for a Genie Award for his soundtrack of the movie "Les Doux Aveus". He has toured the Middle East, Germany, Holland and the North-West Territories.



#### Larry Roy (guitarist)

Larry Roy resides in Winnipeg and can be heard performing with local artists Marilyn Lerner, Wally Larsson, Ron Paley and Stefan Bauer. Larry has made several recordings including his most recent, "Quarter To Three", which features many of his own compositions. He has also appeared on several national radio and television broadcasts.
