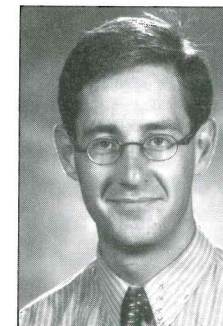

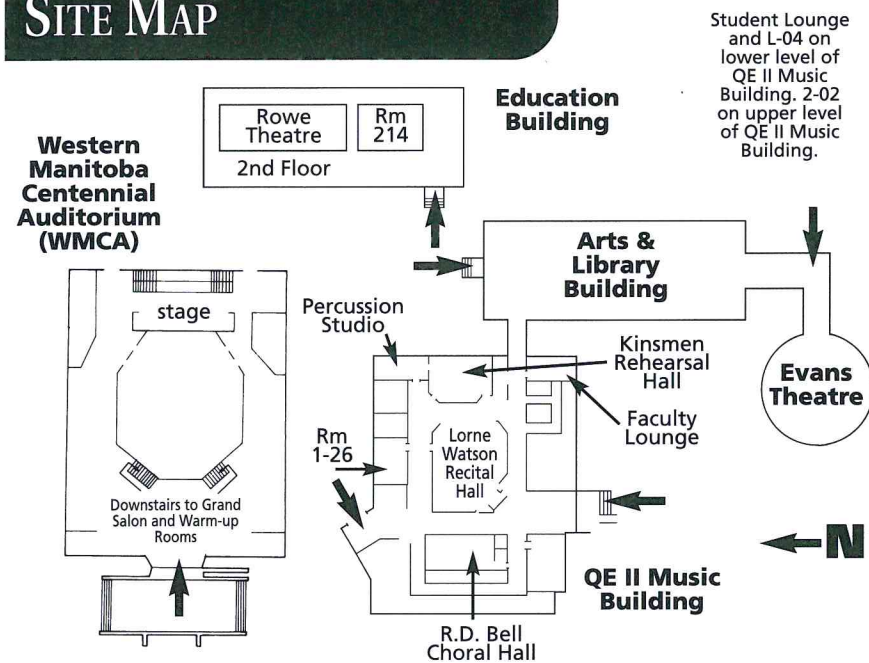

The Tone Poets are Stephanie McLean, vocals; Jacob Langley, guitar; John Sadowy, keyboards; Louis Simao, bass, John Fraboni, Drums.

The Tone Poets will take you from relaxed laid-back sultry jazz through to the wake-up of swing. Much of the sense of the Tone Poets comes through the sultry wit and intelligent phrasing of vocalist Stephanie McLean who moves within arrangements by guitarist/producer Jacob Langley.

The Tone Poets are touring on the strength of two acclaimed CD releases, *Since I Fell For You* (1995) and their recent release, *Pages Unturned* (1998). They draw inspiration from their jazz background and explore other styles from Pop to R&B to Salsa to New Orleans Blues. We will hear the Tone Poets perform interpretations in jazz form by non-jazz composers such as Smokey Robinson, Paul Simon, and Lyall Lovett, as

well as new takes on standards by Irving Berlin and Duke Ellington. Their CDs also include original modern jazz works.

Since 1995, the Tone Poets have performed to great acclaim at almost every jazz festival east of Winnipeg including the Du Maurier Festival International de Jazz de Montreal, the Ottawa International Jazz Festival, the Festival International de Jazz de Rimouski, The Hamilton Jazz Festival, the London Jazz Festival, the Edmundston Jazz Festival, the Moncton Jazz Festival, Quebec City's Nuits Black Jazz Festival, and the Festival by the Sea in Saint John, N.B. They receive regular national airplay on JazzRadio in Canada and the USA, are frequently invited for television engagements, and are always enthusiastically received because of their progressive focus combined with their solid jazz styles.

This is the Tone Poets' first performance at the Brandon Jazz Festival.

ADJUDICATORS, ARTISTS & CLINICIANS

Dr. Ron McCurdy

Dr. Ronald C. McCurdy is Professor of Music and chair of the American Studies Department and serves as Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Minnesota. Prior to his appointment at the University of Minnesota, Dr. McCurdy served seven years as Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Kansas.

Dr. McCurdy is in demand as a guest clinician, soloist, and director of honour Jazz Ensembles and Choirs throughout the United States and Canada. At the University of Minnesota, Dr. McCurdy directs Jazz Ensemble I, Jazz Singers, teaches several jazz-related music courses, and two courses in the Afro-American Studies Department.

He has served as a member of the Jamey Aebersold Jazz Camp faculty and currently serves as Director for the High School All-American Grammy in the Schools Vocal Jazz Ensemble. Dr. McCurdy serves as President-elect of the International Association of Jazz Educators (IAJE).

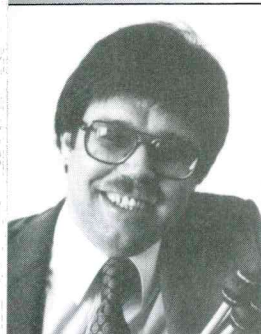

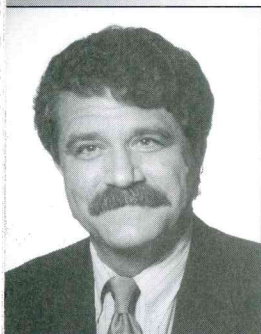
Scott Prebys

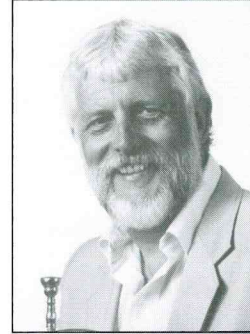

Bob Montgomery

Bob Montgomery is an internationally recognized performing artist who has appeared throughout Europe, Australia, Canada, China, Mexico, Japan and the United States. Bob's reputation as an educator has earned him many awards, including "Teacher of the Year", "Jazz Educator and Performer of the Year", and "Colorado Jazz Educator Of The Year".

Bob was founder and director of Clark Terry's All American Jazz Camp and Rich Mattison's Mile High Jazz Camp, Executive Director of Colorado Jazz Workshops, Inc., board member of the "Colorado Gift of Jazz", and a member of the board of trustees for the International Foundation for Jazz. Bob is a national artist/clinician for the Yamaha Musical Instrument Company, who, in cooperation with St. John's Music, helped make his appearance at the 1999 Brandon Jazz Festival possible.

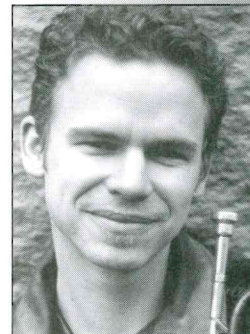

Juno Award-winning artist Brad Turner is fast becoming one of Canada's most prominent jazz artists. Based in Vancouver, Brad is known mainly for his trumpet playing, but actually performs and records professionally on three instruments (trumpet, piano and drums). Brad has performed with such artists as Joe Williams, Freddie Hubbard, Oliver Jones, Wynton Marsalis, Joe Lovano, and his groups have opened for such artists as McCoy Tyner, Terence Blanchard, Clarke Terry, and John Scofield.

As an educator, Brad has been on faculty at the University of North Texas as instructor of improvisation, has worked as an adjudicator, clinician and guest artist throughout Canada and the United States, and is currently on faculty at Capilano College in North Vancouver, B.C.

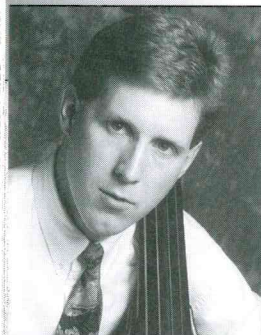

Gordon Foote is currently an Associate Professor in the Jazz Studies Program at McGill University. Serving as the Chair of the Jazz Studies Program, he was instrumental in the development of Canada's first university jazz studies degree program, the Bachelor of Music in Jazz Performance.

Professor Foote is the coordinator of the McGill Jazz Orchestras, and directs McGill Jazz Orchestra I. Under his direction the ensemble has performed throughout the world and won countless awards.

Gordon is one of Canada's busiest clinicians, in demand as an adjudicator, educator, and performer. He is on the advisory board of the International Association of Jazz Educators, and is the Quebec representative.

The Jazz Report magazine calls bassist Mike Downes "one of Canada's immensely talented young giants." Mike has performed throughout the world with many great jazz artists, including Dave Liebman, Peter Erskine, Lew Tabackin, Oliver Jones, Pat LaBarbera, Ranee Lee and others.

Mike is on faculty at the University of Toronto and at Humber College, and is in much demand as a bassist and clinician.

Stewart Wilkinson is head of the Fine Arts Department at Campbell Collegiate, a high school whose music groups have enjoyed international acclaim. In 1992 Stewart and his vocal jazz ensemble, The Classics, presented workshops and performances at the International Society for Music Education conference in Seoul, South Korea. In 1993 The Classics presented a showcase concert at the International Association of Jazz Educators conference in San Antonio, Texas, and in 1995 they performed twice at the Montreux Jazz Festival. In 1996 and 1998 the Campbell Collegiate Chamber Choir was selected as a finalist in the CBC Amateur Choir Competition, and in 1997 were the only North American choir to perform at Festival 500 in St. John's Newfoundland.

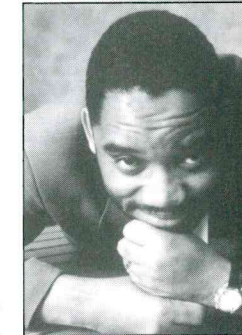
Stewart has been honoured by MusicFest Canada with the first-ever Downbeat Award for excellence in music education in 1990. He was recipient of the Saskatchewan Choral Federation's 1992 Pro Musica Award, and the Saskatchewan Music Educators Association's 1993 Outstanding Achievement Award.

Greg Carroll

As a jazz vibraphone artist and drummer, Greg Carroll has performed with Dave Grusin, Eddie Daniels, Chico Freeman, Louie Bellson, and Red Holloway among others. He continues to record and perform with his own group, Midnight Blue.

Greg has recently been appointed IAJE Director of Education, a position with responsibility for directing IAJE education and outreach programs worldwide. Previous to his appointment with IAJE, Greg was on faculty at the University of Colorado at Boulder, where he served as Director of Jazz Studies. He holds a BME degree from the University of Northern Colorado and a MMED from the University of Colorado.

Prior to joining the faculty at the University of Colorado, he taught instrumental music for several school districts in Colorado. He was named Jazz Educator of the Year by the IAJE Colorado Unit in 1997, has conducted numerous all-state and honour bands, and is past director of the Colorado Jazz Workshop. During his teaching career, his ensembles have consistently earned superior ratings, including 7 Down Beat Student Music Awards.

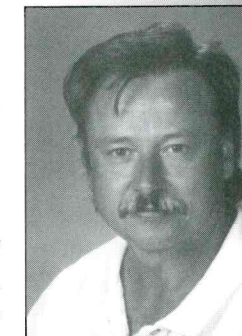

Peter Taylor has been involved with the Jazz Choir movement since its inception in Canada. He taught for 16 years at Carson Graham Secondary, and 14 years at Vancouver Community College where he taught vocal arranging, class jazz/classical piano, Concert Choir, and directed the vocal jazz ensembles Primetime and Soundwave. Mr. Taylor left VCC in 1994 and moved to Powell River where he teaches in the school district, the Powell River Academy of Music, (initiating its first Jazz program) and at Malaspina University College. (Powell River Campus.) He is an accomplished composer/arranger, particularly well known for his writing in the area of vocal jazz. He is on the staff of UNC Jazz Press where a number of his arrangements are being published.

Mr. Taylor is co-founder of the BC Vocal Jazz Festival and is on the board of the Pacific Coast Music Festivals Association. He is also founder of the "Soundwave Vocal Jazz Summer Workshop", the "VCC Invitational Music Festival," the Powell River Academy of Music "Vocal Jazz Summit" and is president/founder of the "West Coast Jazz and Blues Society."

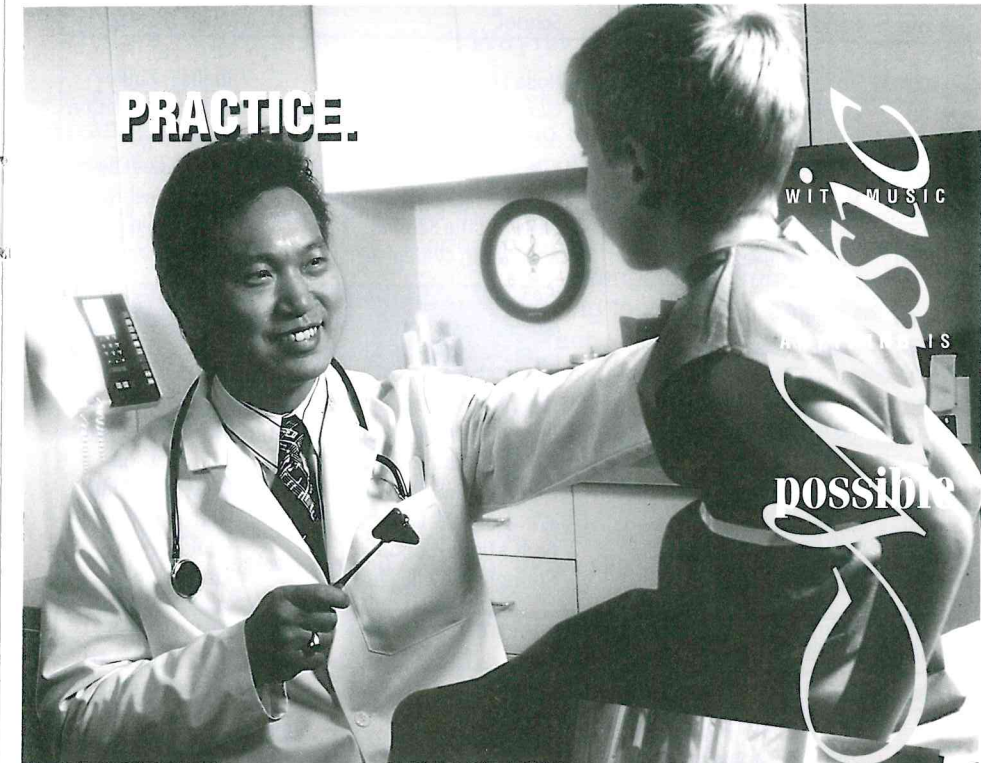

An intensive course of Master-level study designed to explore newly-approved senior jazz curriculum and develop the basic skills and concepts necessary to its successful implementation.

The new curriculum provides for a comprehensive approach to jazz education, with specific emphasis upon ear training, jazz theory, rhythm, keyboarding, composition and arranging, instrumental skills, jazz history, and vocal skills, and a strong foundational emphasis on listening. This course will address each of these in turn, and be organized to permit students to devote particular attention to specific areas of personal need and interest. Some attention will also be devoted to the use of technological instructional aids in jazz education.

Previous experience in jazz, though helpful, is not required.

The course will run from July 5 - 16, 1999 at Brandon University and may earn Masters degree credit for those eligible. Participants who do not wish degree credit may enroll as Special Students given documentation of successful completion of the Bachelors degree in music or music education.
