Welcome to the 18th Annual Brandon Jazz Festival. We have a record 135 groups entered this year, involving over 2500 students, performing on five stages. The addition of Thursday performances and a Thursday evening WMCA concert has allowed more students and schools to participate than ever before. Congratulations to the almost 100 directors taking part in this year's festival for your dedication and commitment to jazz education.

On a more personal note, I find it incredible to have observed the growth of this festival. As a grade 9 student performing in the very first Brandon Stage Band Festival (as it was then called) eighteen years ago, I never imagined that I would eventually go on to become a volunteer with the festival, watching it grow larger and larger each and every year. Over the years I have helped out in numerous capacities - from t-shirts and posters, to group guiding and running almost every venue. (I was also the one who overslept in 1987, causing the festival to run late for the only time in its history!) Who knew I would end up coordinating the whole event for five years running?

We have had over 100 adjudicators and performers attend the Jazz Festival from all parts of North America. Through word of mouth, the festival has gained recognition as one of this continent's top jazz education events. (True story: I was in a men's room at the International Association of Jazz Educators Conference in New Orleans when a gentleman from Texas spotted my BJF t-shirt and proceeded to tell me what an incredible festival it was!) The festival's reputation has been built on the hard work and dedication of hundreds and hundreds of volunteers over the years. Please take the time to thank them. THEY are the Brandon Jazz Festival. And if you are presently a grade 9 student, remember: YOU could be running this festival some day.

Roger Mantie Festival Coordinator

Roger Mantie teaches at Springfield Collegiate in Oakbank. He has directed ensembles at Brandon University and the University of Manitoba, and is on the faculty of the Mile High Jazz Camp and the University of Manitoba Jazz Camp. Roger also performs regularly with Saxology Canada and the Winnipeg Jazz Orchestra.

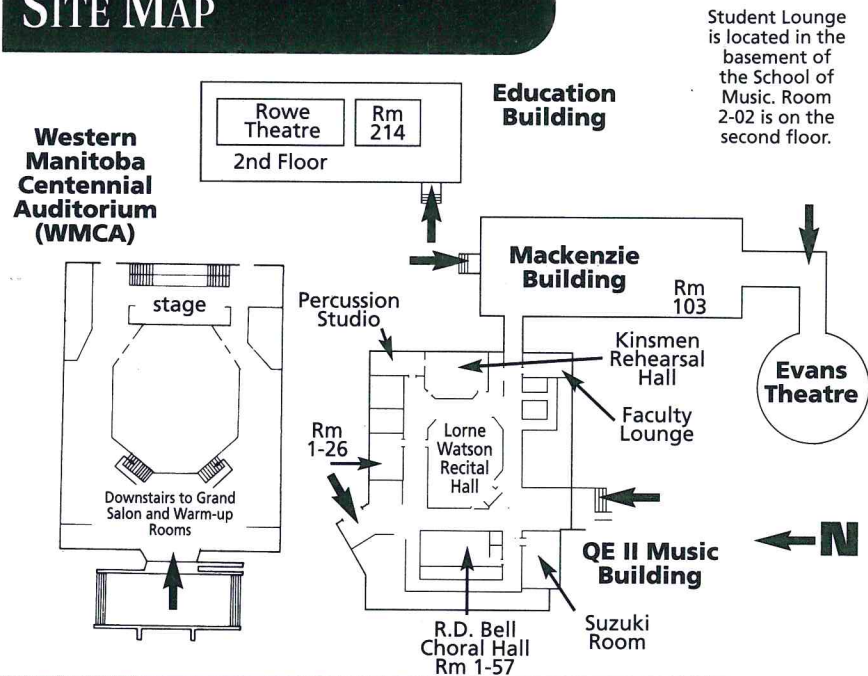

Steve Koven Trio

The Steve Koven Trio is a Toronto-based jazz group that performs spontaneous, animated, and highly energetic renditions of jazz standards and original material. The trio has been performing since 1995 with their present personnel of Steve at the piano, Rob Clutton on bass, and drummer Anthony Michelli.

The band released their debut CD, *Live at the Senator*, in 1997 which received national air play, as well as high praise from music critics all over the country. In 1999 the trio released their second CD, *Sandbox*. In 1998 the trio performed at the Barbados International Jazz Festival, Jamaica Jazz Festival, and a cross-Canada tour. In the Barbados Festival they appeared directly after John Pizzarelli, with the following review...

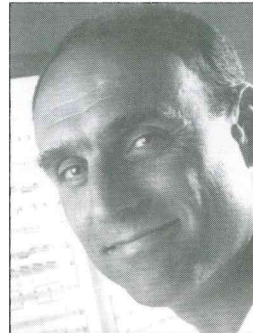

ADJUDICATORS, ARTISTS & CLINICIANS

Bob Rebagliati

Mr. Rebagliati is a native of Kelowna, British Columbia. He holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the U.B.C. and a Masters of Music degree from Western Washington University. His main post-graduate activity was the writing of an extensive manual for the development of the young jazz rhythm section. He has continued to write newsletter articles and curriculum in this and concert band areas.

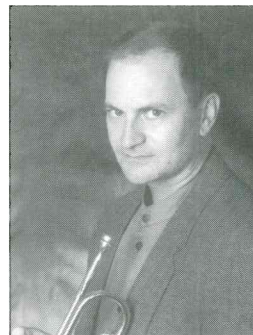
At the 1991 B.C. Music Educators conference, Mr. Rebagliati was honoured with the annual Professional Educator Award, and in 1994, he received the North Vancouver Music Educators' Award of Excellence. His school's jazz program recently was awarded "High School Jazz Program of the Year" by *Jazz Report Magazine* of Toronto.



Chase Sanborn

Chase Sanborn is one of the most widely respected jazz trumpet players and teachers in Canada. He has worked or studied in New York, Boston, Philadelphia, San Francisco & Los Angeles. Currently making his home in Toronto, Chase is a veteran of the theatre pits, recording studios and jazz clubs, and has performed on hundreds of recording sessions for TV, film, and radio. He has been a featured soloist with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra and the Boss Brass, and has performed with artists such as Ray Charles, Gil Evans, Aretha Franklin, and Natalie Cole.

Chase teaches at the University of Toronto, and serves as a clinician for Boosey & Hawkes. He writes the brass column for *Canadian Musician Magazine*, and is the author of two critically acclaimed textbooks: *Brass Tactics & The Brass Tactics Companion*. We would like to thank Boosey & Hawkes and Ted Good Music for helping make Chase's appearance possible at this year's Brandon Jazz Festival.

Trish Colter

Trish Colter has performed as a professional vocalist since 1976. She has appeared with notable jazz artists Guido Basso, Pat LaBarbera, Frank Mantooth and Don Thompson, and has opened for Buddy DeFranco and Marvin Hamlisch. Trish performs regularly in Toronto jazz clubs and has appeared at many jazz festivals, including the mainstage at the du Maurier Downtown Toronto Jazz Festival. In addition, Trish has been a featured artist on Laurentian University's *Jazz Concert Series*, the CBC radio series *Live At Five*, the CJRT FM *Sounds of Toronto Jazz Series* and the Markham *Women In Jazz Concert Series*.

Trish joined the music faculty of Humber College in 1986 and in 1987 was appointed full time head of the vocal department. She conducts the award-winning Humber College Vocal Jazz Ensemble and is in demand as a clinician for ensemble and solo voices in high schools, colleges and universities across Ontario. Trish is also on the faculty of the National Music Camp's Jazz Program and has adjudicated for music festivals such as the International Festival and MusicFest Canada.

Rob Somerville

Rob Somerville has studied and attended clinics with Dave McMurdo, Julian Priester, Hal Crook, Bill Watrous, and Conrad Herwig. He is currently the lead trombone with the Dave McMurdo Jazz Orchestra, and a member of Freeflight. He has toured the former Soviet Union and recorded 4 CDs with the Jazz Orchestra and two with Freeflight. Rob has also performed with various bands at most Canadian Jazz Festivals, including Montreal, Toronto, Vancouver, Ottawa, Calgary, and Edmonton. Besides playing on many CBC and CJRT radio broadcasts and CTV Holiday Specials, he has backed up various popular music groups including Manhattan Transfer, The Temptations, Roger Daltrey, and The Cowboy Junkies, among others.

His instruction includes teaching at the National Music Camp, Saskatchewan Jazz Camp, and the International Music Camp. He is also the former director of the McMaster University Jazz Band, and has taught in clinics, camps, and privately for 15 years.

Kieran Overs

Kieran Overs has been active on the Canadian music scene since 1970. He has studied bass with renowned Danish bassist Neils-Henning Orsted-Petersen and arranging with the Boss Brass's Rick Wilkins. Working in Toronto as a sideman with such artists as Zoot Sims, Chet Baker, Sonny Fortune, Dewey Redman, Barry Harris, and touring internationally with Moe Koffman/Dizzy Gillespie and Jane Bunnett, he has established a solid reputation in Canadian jazz.

Overs was one of only 8 jazz artists selected to represent Canada on the 4CD/50-artist boxed set *HERE AND NOW - A Celebration Of Canadian Music*, produced by the Canada Council to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the United Nations (released worldwide in October 1995). In 1994, Kieran was bassist, producer and recording engineer for Alex



Dean's quintet recording *Kaitlyn's Waltz*, which won *The Jazz Report's* "Best Jazz CD" of 1994 and was on New York's *Village Voice* "Top 10 Jazz Recordings" list for that year. In addition to his freelance work, Overs teaches at Toronto's Humber College.

Andre White

Exposed to music throughout his childhood, Andre White completed his formal music studies at Vanier College, as well as earning a B.A. in English Literature from Concordia University and a M.Mus. in Sound Recording from McGill University. Montreal continues to be his home base, although he works frequently outside of the province of Quebec. He is presently employed as an Associate Professor in Jazz Studies at McGill University, where he teaches Jazz History, Jazz Piano and Drums, and Jazz Improvisation.

Andre has appeared with many Canadian and American musicians, both in Montreal and elsewhere. Some of the performers he has accompanied include Benny Carter, Dizzy Gillespie, Barry Harris, Bernie Senensky, Dave Liebman, Don Thompson, Steve Grossman, Sonny Greenwich, Pepper Adams, Cecil Payne, Junior Cook, Bob Berg, Rob McConnell, and Kevin Dean.

Scott Leithead

In addition to being the Founder and Artistic Director of FORM Vocal Jazz and the Kokopelli Youth Choir, Scott also conducts several other award winning choirs including two Columbian Jazz Choirs ('Nuf Sed and Postdated Adult Jazz), The Edmonton Youth Choir, the Brailletones (a choir for people with disabilities), and the St. Alphonsus Junior High Choir. Many of these choirs have been featured in regional, national, and international festival spotlight performances. Scott has adjudicated some of the largest vocal festivals in North America including the Ontario Vocal Festival, Choralfest Manitoba, the Washington State Choral Festival, and Musicfest Canada.

Scott was the recipient of The 1996 Edmonton Salute to Excellence Award for outstanding educational work with youth and was nominated "Edmonton's Most Aspiring Artist" at the 1999 Mayor's Luncheon for Business and the Arts.

Mario Melo

Presently, Mario Melo and Producer Ken Worth have joined their expertise to record an innovative CD entitled *Deep*. From a Composer's and Percussionist standpoint, Mario's compositions stem from an original musical concept to revive distinctive rhythms and melodies with the power to captivate and entrance listeners. His goal is to amalgamate his music for larger audiences by transcending boundaries and blending the sounds of African, Latin, Brazilian, Flamenco, Rock, and Pop music.

His most recent achievement involved recording the percussion theme, vocals and score for *Peter Benchley's Amazon*, a well received, world syndicated weekly television drama.

Mario is an active member of Cha-Locos. This Afro-Latin-Pop group has combined fascinating rhythms in their repertoire: Lando, Festejo, Calypso, Parranda and Rock (Canadian Tour). They have released two CDs, *Mi Camino* and *Planet Ritmo*.



Jim Mackay

As Director of Bands for twenty-four years at Silver Heights Collegiate, bands under Jim's direction received countless awards of excellence at local, national and international music festivals. Jim's symphonic bands and jazz ensembles participated in festivals in the United States, England, Scotland, Wales, Germany, Switzerland, Austria and the prestigious World Music Festival in Kerkrade, Holland.

Jim has served as President of the Manitoba Band Director's Association on three different occasions and continues to serve as a guest clinician, guest artist and guest conductor for schools and school divisions. Currently, Jim is a sessional instructor at Brandon University and director of the Jazz Ensemble.

Jim has been recognized locally, nationally and internationally for contributions to music and school band education. Most notably are the Paul Harris Award of Professional Excellence (Rotary International) and Sudler Award of Distinction (John Phillip Sousa Foundation). Recently, Jim received the Prime Minister's Award of Teaching Excellence.



Levon Ichkhanian

Veterans of the Brandon Jazz Festival will well remember Canadian/Armenian guitarist/composer Levon Ichkhanian's electrifying performances at the 1998 festival. Contemporary jazz with world beat overtones aptly describes the music of this great artist. His primary instrument is the electric guitar, but he is also proficient with the acoustic guitar, bouzouki, oud, banjitar and mandolin.

Years of study and practical experience behind him, Levon shares his knowledge with students as a Jazz Guitar Faculty Member of the National Guitar Summer Workshop. He is much sought after to conduct World/Jazz Improvisation Clinics, and his "Hijaz for Guitar" session has been published in *Guitar Player's* July 1998 issue. A recipient of the Governor General of Canada's acknowledgement for musical excellence, Levon has been recognized as a musical ambassador to Canada, and has

given command performances for Heads of State and dignitaries from Armenia, Greece and Lebanon.

Kirk Macdonald

Kirk MacDonald has worked with many leading jazz musicians including Claude Ranger, Dave Young, Sam Noto, Sonny Greenwich, Kenny Wheeler, Eddie Henderson, Harold Mabern, Walter Bishop Jr., Lorne Lofsky, Bob Mover, Pat LaBarbera, Phil Woods, John Taylor, and Ron McClure. Kirk has appeared on over 20 jazz recordings. In addition, he has recorded over 25 of his own compositions on CD.

Kirk's many awards include a 1999 Juno for Best Mainstream Jazz Album (*The Atlantic Sessions*), and 1999 Jazz Report Awards for both Tenor Saxophonist of the Year and Album of the Year. He has performed at many Jazz Festivals and clubs/concerts throughout Canada, the United States, Australia, Italy, Spain and Korea. Kirk is Instructor of Saxophone, Improvisation, Ensembles, and Ear Training at the University of Toronto.



Larry Nickel

Larry Nickel has been a High School Performing Arts teacher for the past 21 years, teaching Concert Band, Jazz Band, Concert Choir, Handbells, Vocal Jazz and Acting. He has directed over 50 stage productions, including several Gilbert and Sullivan Operettas.

In 1992, Larry's stage band was selected at the Canadian Music Festival to represent Canada at the Jazz Educator's Convention in San Antonio. In 1993 he received the International Jazz Educator's Award for "Outstanding Service to Jazz Education." His choirs have recorded for television together with Bob McGrath (of *Sesame Street*), Bill Samples, Paul Baron, Dee Daniels, Warren Wiebe, Mike Reno, Paul Janz, and Sheri Ulrich. This year his choir was invited to join the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra for a "Gospel Celebration."

His compositions have been recorded by tenor Ben Heppner, sopranos Ingrid Suderman and Edith Wiens, the Cornucopia Brass Ensemble, Chor Leoni, the Vancouver Cantata Singers, cellist John Friesen, and the Bradenburg String Quartet.
