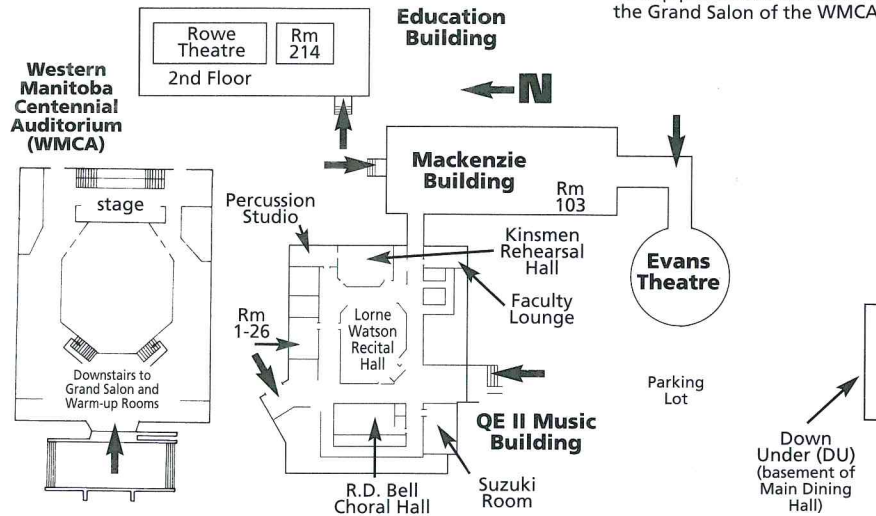

Metalwood has become the leader in Canada's Contemporary Jazz scene and is producing some of the most adventurous and innovative sounds in music today. The Victoria Jazz Society describes their music as "high energy jazz with driving grooves and world class improvisation."

Their first two recordings were honoured with the 1998 and 1999 Juno Awards for Best Contemporary Jazz Album. They have been recognized as Talent Deserving Wider Recognition in *Down Beat Magazine* and were voted 1999 Electric Jazz Group of the Year by Canada's *Jazz Report Magazine*. They have since released *Metalwood 3* and *Metalwood Live*, also to critical acclaim. Their first record with Universal was recorded this winter and will be available in the spring.

Metalwood took its influence from the 1970's sounds of Miles Davis, Weather Report and Return to Forever. They have created a sound that can be playful, heavy, groovy and sophisticated.

The Francois Bourassa Trio with Andre Leroux is one of the most active and popular jazz groups in Canada. They were described in the *Toronto Star* as "the very essence of jazz," and in *Jazz Times* as "creative... mystical... exotic... bluesy... joyful." Their most recent CD, *Cactus*, is described by Fred Hersch as "interesting, exploratory and passionate music that is well worth spending time with."

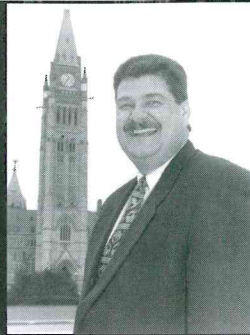



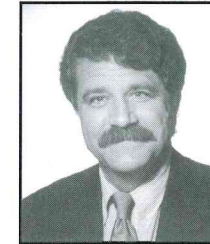

ADJUDICATORS, ARTISTS & CLINICIANS



Wayne Bowman | Instrumental

Wayne Bowman is Professor of Music and of Music Education at Brandon University. An accomplished scholar, trombonist, and educator, he has long been active in the promotion of jazz education in Manitoba and Canada. He co-founded (with David Schmidt) the Brandon Jazz Festival in 1982. Dr. Bowman is an internationally renowned expert in philosophy of music and music education, with dozens of articles and a major book to his credit.



Jim Brenan | Saxophone

Jim Brenan attended Grant McEwan Community College in Edmonton, Alberta, Saint Francis Xavier in Antigonish, Nova Scotia and completed a Masters Degree in Jazz Studies at Rutgers, studying with tenor saxophonist Ralph Bowen.

Jim has recorded with Kenny Wheeler and the Canadian Jazz Orchestra in Banff Alberta and has performed in the tri-state area: New York, Philadelphia and New Jersey.

Jim is Professor of Woodwinds at Keyano College in Fort McMurray, Alberta. His first solo, self titled recording was listed as the Jazz Album of the Year by Roger Leveque of the *Edmonton Journal* and Peter North of *See Magazine*.

P.J. Perry calls Jim Brenan "...the best young tenor player in the country, a national treasure."



Trish Colter | Vocal

Trish Colter has performed as a professional vocalist since 1976. She has appeared with notable jazz artists Guido Basso, Pat LaBarbera, Frank Mantooth and Don Thompson, and has opened for Buddy DeFranco and Marvin Hamlisch. Trish performs regularly in Toronto jazz clubs and has appeared at many jazz festivals, including the mainstage at the du Maurier Downtown Toronto Jazz Festival. In addition, Trish has been a featured artist on Laurentian University's *Jazz Concert Series*, the CBC radio series *Live At Five*, the CJRT FM *Sounds of Toronto Jazz Series* and the *Markham Women In Jazz Concert Series*.

Trish joined the music faculty of Humber College in 1986 and in 1987 was appointed full-time head of the vocal department. She conducts the award-winning Humber College Vocal Jazz Ensemble and is in demand as a clinician for ensemble and solo voices in high schools, colleges and universities across Ontario. Trish is also on the faculty of the National Music Camp's Jazz Program and has adjudicated for music festivals such as the International Festival and MusicFest Canada.



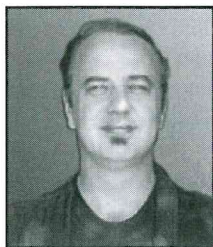
Gilles Fournier | Instrumental

Gilles studied at St. Francis Xavier University. He also participated in the Banff Summer Jazz Program, studying with renowned bassist Rufus Reid. Gilles has also studied with Dave Young, Michel Donato, Charles Fambrough, Mike Richmond, Neil Swenson, Don Thompson and Victor Wooten.

His resume includes performances and recordings with many of the brightest lights in the international jazz world including Clark Terry, Arturo Sandoval, Kenny Wheeler, Peter Appleyard, Kevin Eubanks, Paquito D'Rivera, Phil Nimmons and Steve Coleman.

He is equally at home with all styles of music, supporting such artists as the Wyrd Sisters, Scruj MacDuhk, Richard Moody, James Keelaghan, Steve Bell, and Fred Penner.

Gilles has worked with young musicians at the University of Manitoba Summer Jazz Camp.

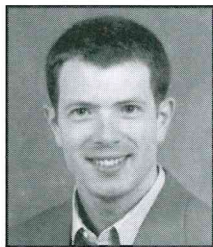


Hugh Fraser | Trombone

Hugh Fraser is currently head of jazz composition at the Royal Academy of Music in London, England and Program Head of the summer jazz workshop at the University of Ulster in Northern Ireland.

Hugh Fraser has made an incredible impact on the Canadian music scene for over two decades as a performer on both trombone and piano, as a composer, and as an educator. He formed the 13 member Vancouver Ensemble of Jazz Improvisation in 1980, and went on to international success with the Hugh Fraser Quintet from 1986.

The Quintet has recorded four albums and won a 1998 Juno for the most recent, *In the Mean Time*. Hugh was voted trombonist of the year by *Toronto's Jazz Report Magazine* in 1996 and 1998.

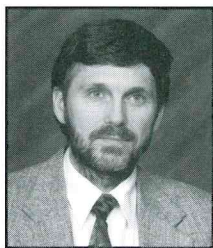


Greg Gatien | Instrumental

Greg is the newest member of the Faculty of Music at Brandon University. He teaches courses in jazz and music education.

Greg received his undergraduate degree in jazz studies and music education from St. Francis Xavier University. He completed his masters at Eastman School of Music and is completing his doctoral studies at the New England Conservatory.

Greg has performed with many internationally renowned artists including Joe Henderson, Benny Carter and Bob Brookmeyer.



Richard Gillis | Instrumental

Originally from Saskatchewan, Richard Gillis studied trumpet at the Saskatchewan Summer School of the Arts, the Saskatchewan Youth Band, The University of Saskatchewan (B.Mus.), The Banff Centre, and The University of Michigan (M.Mus.; D.M.A.). In Michigan, Mr. Gillis studied with Armando Ghitalla and played in The University of Michigan faculty brass quintet. Dr. Gillis directs the Jazz Orchestra and teaches trumpet at The University of Manitoba, and is quite active as a clinician, adjudicator,

and performer. Mr. Gillis performs with a number of groups, including the Ron Paley Big Band, Stefan Bauer, and Bjorn Thoroddsen, and is presently working on a CD with "Guitar Islancio." He is also co-founder (with Sasha Boychouk) and musical director of the Winnipeg Jazz Orchestra.



Kate Hammett-Vaughan | Vocal

Vancouver's Kate Hammett-Vaughan is one of Canada's preeminent jazz vocalists. Equally acclaimed for her interpretations of jazz standards and for her improvising work with avant garde groups such as the NOW Orchestra and Garbo's Hat, she has received two JUNO nominations since 1994.

One of Vancouver's busiest voice teachers, Kate recently completed a concert of original art songs by some of Vancouver's leading contemporary music composers. She is now working on her second recording of jazz standards for Maximum Jazz.

In her performing and recording career, Hammett-Vaughan's musical interests have led her to a variety of related projects, including film scores, guest hosting of CBC television and radio shows, and collaborations with modern dance artists.



Kristin Korb | Bass / Vocal

Kristin received a bachelor's degree in music education from Eastern Montana College. In 1992 she went to San Diego to hone her bass skills with local bassist and professor Bertram Turetzky. Kristin earned a Masters Degree from the University of California, San Diego and became one of the busiest bassists in San Diego.

Kristin is now touring internationally as both an artist and educator. Her debut CD, *Introducing Kristin Korb*, is out on the Telarc label and Kristin is making a splash in the jazz world and with every concert. She creates an exciting and unique bass and vocal performance.



Earl MacDonald | Piano

A native of Canada, Earl received a Masters Degree in Jazz Studies from Rutgers University and a Bachelor of Music with distinction in jazz piano from McGill University. Kenny Barron, with whom Earl apprenticed, considers Earl to be "an extremely fine pianist and composer with a firm grasp of the jazz tradition."

Earl's first CD, *Schroeder's Tantrum*, was released in 1997 on the Radioland label, and is distributed by Universal. An all-star cast of musicians join Earl to perform his original compositions and arrangements.

Earl is presently the Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Connecticut. He adjudicates educational festivals throughout the year, and teaches at summer jazz camps.



Lisa Martinelli | Vocal

Since moving to Toronto from Sault Ste. Marie in 1984, Lisa has been an active educator, clinician and performer. She is a graduate of the University of Toronto, Humber College and also attended the Banff School of Fine Arts. She is a freelance vocalist in the Toronto area where she leads her own jazz trio and quintet.

Lisa maintains a busy teaching schedule as a faculty member of both Humber College and the University of Toronto. She has also appeared as a featured artist and choir director at many schools, music camps and festivals. Lisa is currently the director of the University of Toronto Vocal Jazz Ensemble.



Terry O'Mahoney | Drums

Terry O'Mahoney received his undergraduate degree from the University of Louisville in 1982 and continued his studies with jazz drumming great Jeff Hamilton in Los Angeles. He received his Masters in Jazz Performance from the University of Miami.

He is currently the percussion/drumset teacher at St. Francis Xavier University in Antigonish, Nova Scotia. He has appeared with trombonist Curtis Fuller and saxophonist Phil Woods, guitarists Ed Bickert and John Abercrombie, pianist Oliver Jones and Doug Riley, vocalists Jeri Brown and Rane Lee, trumpeter Marvin Stamm, vibraphonist/pianist Don Thompson, and many others. He has published percussion ensemble works and has written articles for noted percussion journals. He remains active as a clinician and adjudicator. Terry plays Sabian cymbals and Vic Firth sticks exclusively.



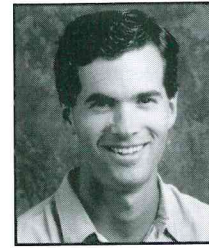
Jim Mackay | Instrumental

As Director of Bands for twenty-four years at Silver Heights Collegiate, bands under Jim's direction received countless awards of excellence at local, national and international music festivals. Jim's symphonic bands and jazz ensembles participated in festivals in the United States, England, Scotland, Wales, Germany, Switzerland, Austria and the prestigious World Music Festival in Kerkrade, Holland.

Jim has served as President of the Manitoba Band Director's Association on three different occasions and continues to serve as a guest clinician, guest artist and guest conductor for schools and school divisions.

Jim has been recognized locally, nationally and internationally for contributions to music and school band education. Most notable are the Paul Harris Award of Professional Excellence (Rotary International) and Sudler Award of Distinction (John Phillip Sousa Foundation). Recently, Jim received the Prime Minister's Award of Teaching Excellence.

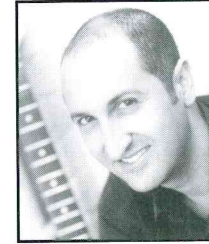

Dean McNeill | Trumpet

Dean McNeill teaches jazz and brass related courses at the University of Saskatchewan and has performed with the likes of Tommy Banks, P.J. Perry, Garry Guthman and Sam Pilafian. Dean holds a Masters Degree in Jazz Studies from the University of North Texas, a Bachelors Degree in Jazz from McGill University and a Music Diploma from Grant MacEwan.

In 1998 McNeill's arrangement of the jazz standard *All of You* won the "University Student Big Band Arrangement of the Year" in *Down Beat Magazine*. Dean is currently a member of the Saskatoon Symphony, the Saskatchewan Brass and the Metro Jazz Ensemble, and is the Secretary-Treasurer of Jazz Canada.



Michael Occhipinti | Guitar

Guitarist / composer Michael Occhipinti is best known as the co-leader and composer for the 16 piece group NOJO, winners of the 1996 JUNO Award for Best Contemporary Jazz Album. NOJO's 1999 JUNO-nominated CD, *You Are Here*, features the clarinet work of Don Byron.

The Michael Occhipinti Quartet strives to perform music that is personal, creative, and a break from the traditional jazz repertoire. Their new CD, *Creation Dream* (True North / Universal), features unique arrangements of the songs of Bruce Cockburn.

Michael Occhipinti had been profiled and recorded for CBC television, Bravo!, CBC radio and TV Ontario, and is a main stage performer at jazz clubs and festivals from Vancouver to Halifax.

Jerry Steinholtz | Percussion

Jerry began his career as a Latin percussionist while living in Los Angeles. His career has enabled him to play with such musicians as Diana Ross, the Four Tops, Karen and Richard Carpenter, Gladys Knight and the Pips, and such jazz greats as Louis Bellson, Buddy Rich, Mel Lewis and Chester Thompson. Currently the co-director of percussion at Los Angeles Music Academy, Jerry has been actively involved in percussion education throughout California and the United States. He has created an instructional video on the methods of playing the conga drum, *Essence of Playing Conga*, which is being distributed throughout the world. Jerry appears courtesy of B&J Music.

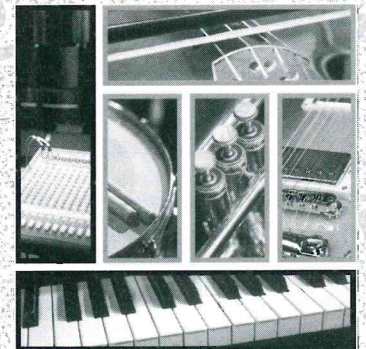

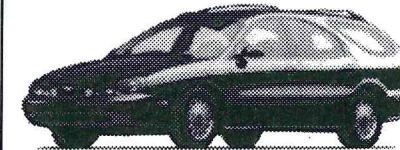
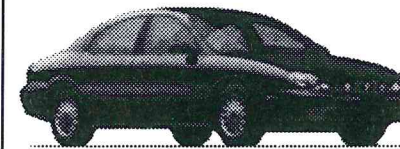
