STEFAN BAUER - VIBRAPHONE

Internationally regarded as a dynamic and flexible improvisor who competently moves within a wide spectrum between mainstream and avant garde, vibist Stefan Bauer has toured extensively around the world. Since 1981 he has led his own groups on annual German tours and has recorded and participated in numerous radio and TV broadcasts in several countries. Besides his work as an active performer and composer, Bauer frequently teaches piano, vibraphone, and composition at various institutions in both Germany and Canada.

WAYNE BOWMAN - INSTRUMENTAL

Wayne Bowman is Professor of Music and of Music Education at Brandon University. An accomplished scholar, trombonist, and educator, he has long been active in the promotion of jazz education in Manitoba and Canada. He co-founded (with David Schmidt) the Brandon Jazz Festival in 1982. Dr. Bowman is an internationally renowned expert in philosophy of music and music education, with dozens of articles and a major book to his credit.

TERRY CLARKE - DRUMS

Terry Clarke's credits read like a who's who of jazz. Terry has worked with Jim Hall for 20 years, has performed and recorded with Rob McConnell, Ed Bickert, Don Thompson,

John Handy, Helen Merrill, Joe Lovano, John Abercrombia and countless others. Terry is recognized as one of the top drummers in the world and is again active in the Canadian scene after a 20-year career based in New York.

LISA FIELDER - VOCAI

Lisa has been the director of choral music at Lindsay Thurber High School in Red Deer, Alberta, since 1989. A graduate of Dickinson State University with a Bachelor of Science in Education and a Secondary Choral Music major, she teaches six high school choirs, and is the founder and director of the community-based Inter School Youth Choir. She is a member of IAJE and the Alberta Choral Federation, and is frequently requested as a clinician.

JANICE FINLAY - SAXOPHONE

Musical director and member of The Swing Cats, leade of her own musical groups, and member of the Ror Paley Big Band, the Winnipeg Jazz Orchestra, the Meisterswingers and the Eli Herscovitch Orchestra Janice is extremely versatile and one of Winnipeg's busiest woodwind players. Besides performances with numerous jazz and mainstream artists, Finlay's work car be heard on more than 10 albums, several film score: and numerous radio and television productions. He passion and enthusiasm make her a popular choice as educator and clinician.

HUGH FRASER - TROMBONE

Hugh Fraser is currently head of jazz composition at the Royal Academy of Music in London, England, and director of the Summer Jazz Workshop at the University of Ulster in Northern Ireland, Hugh has made an incredible impact on the Canadian music scene for over two decades as a performer on both trombone and piano and as a composer and educator. The Hugh Fraser Ouintet, formed in 1986, has recorded four albums and won a 1998 Juno for its most recent one, In the Mean Time. In 1996 and 1998 Hugh was voted trombonist of the year by Toronto's Jazz Report Magazine, Hugh Fraser's appearance at the BJF is sponsored in part by UMI.

ANDREW GREEN - GUITAR

Guitarist Andrew Green has performed with such jazz luminaries as Donald Byrd, Billy Hart, George Garzone, Willie Smith and John McNeil, among others, and is currently active on the New York jazz scene. A graduate of the University of Miami and Western Michigan University, Greg Jasperse currently works in and around Chicago where he freelances as a singer, pianist, writer and teacher. Greg has sung with and/or arranged back-up vocals for Rosemary Clooney, the late Joe Williams, Dianne Reeves, Diane Schuur, Toni Tennille, Jon Secada, and Gloria Estefan. STEVE LAGIMODIER - GUITAR

Steve Lagimodiere has been a music educator for over 15 years. He currently heads the guitar / bass dept. at The Music Cellar based in Winnipeg. His diverse methods and vast curriculum have proven very effective in the student,s progress as both player and well-rounded musician. 

RON PALEY - PIANO

After playing with the big bands of Buddy Rich and Woody Herman, including a month-long tour with Frank Sinatra, Ron Paley returned to Winnipeg in 1976 to form the Ron Paley Big Band. He played on two Woody Herman albums and one Frank Sinatra album. He has recorded four of his own albums, including the latest, a jazz trio album called The Sea of Time. A fifth album containing material from an upcoming big band musical called Bring 'Em Back! is nearly completed.

IAMES POPEIOY - PERCUSSION

James Popejoy is Director of Bands at the University of North Dakota and Music Director and Conductor of the Greater Grand Forks Youth Symphony. He earned his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Conducting from the University of North Texas. He has several articles published in the Teaching Music Through Performance in Band series, having also served as a production assistant and performer on the recordings that accompany these books. Dr. Popeiov remains active as a classical and jazz percussionist, as well as a clinician and guest conductor.

SCOTT PREBYS - DRUMS

Scott Prebvs serves as Director of Percussion/Jazz Studies at the University of Mary in Bismarck, North Dakota. Under his direction, the award-winning University of Mary Jazz Ensemble has performed in numerous American and European jazz festivals. In addition to an active clinic/performance schedule, Scott also directs the U-Mary Percussion Group and Steel Drum Band. He holds performance degrees from the University of Colorado and Indiana State University and has done post-graduate study at the Eastman School of Music.

KATE REID - VOCAL

A 1992 graduate of the Western Michigan University jazz studies program, Kate has received numerous Outstanding Performance awards and has had the opportunity to perform and record for several prestigious events and with many jazz greats. Her first CD, entitled I Can Dream, was released in May, 1997. Kate is currently a member of the Dorsey Orchestra vocal quartet and is working on her doctorate in jazz performance at the University of Miami in Florida while spending her summers performing in Tokyo, Japan.

DOUG RILEY - ORGAN

B3 organ legend Doug Riley has produced records for Moe Koffman, Gordon Lightfoot, Bob Segar, Anne Murray, and Ray Charles, as well as his own CDs, Freedom and Con Alma. Doug has arranged for jazz albums by the Brecker Brothers, David Clayton Thomas, Blood, Sweat and Tears and has written for Ofra Harnoy, Andrew David, and the National Ballet to name a few, not to mention the countless jingles, TV and film scores. Doug's legendary talents have made him one of the most indemand musicians on the scene today.
