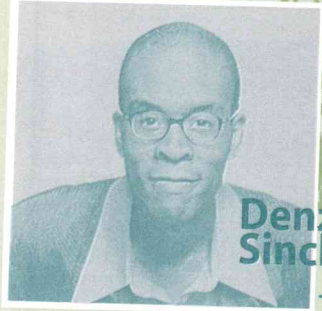
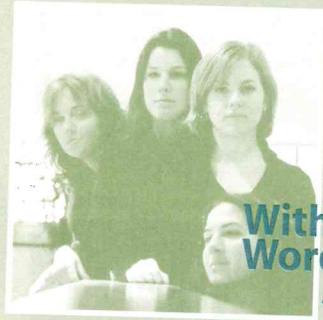

In Memory of Cham Paine

Leslie "Cham" Paine, the legendary Jazz Pianist, passed away New Year's Day after a courageous battle with cancer, at the age of 73.

Cham was a long time fixture in the local Jazz scene. He was a distinguished composer, arranger, educator and musician for almost 40 years. Cham was the "Soul" of Brandon Jazz. He played trumpet, valve trombone and vibes, but his main instrument was the piano.

Cham's composing was tailored to the abilities of the player and he could make any tune sound interesting. His enthusiastic encouragement was never partial to a student or an experienced musician. He was always a positive reinforcement. Cham openly shared his knowledge of Jazz to anyone who was interested.

In the 1980's Cham helped to found the Jazz Society of Brandon as well as the B.I.G. Band. It was here that Cham brought together musicians of all ages to delight Jazz fans. Cham taught Jazz History

at Brandon University and at the Nelson Campus of the University of British Columbia.

Cham was inspiring to all musicians but was very humble in his own accomplishments. His biggest supporters were his lovely wife, Shirley Jo, their 3 children and grandchildren. They were the driving force in Cham's life.

The local Jazz community has lost a great musician and a dedicated friend but Cham has left wonderful memories and a legacy of music. — Doug Sullivan

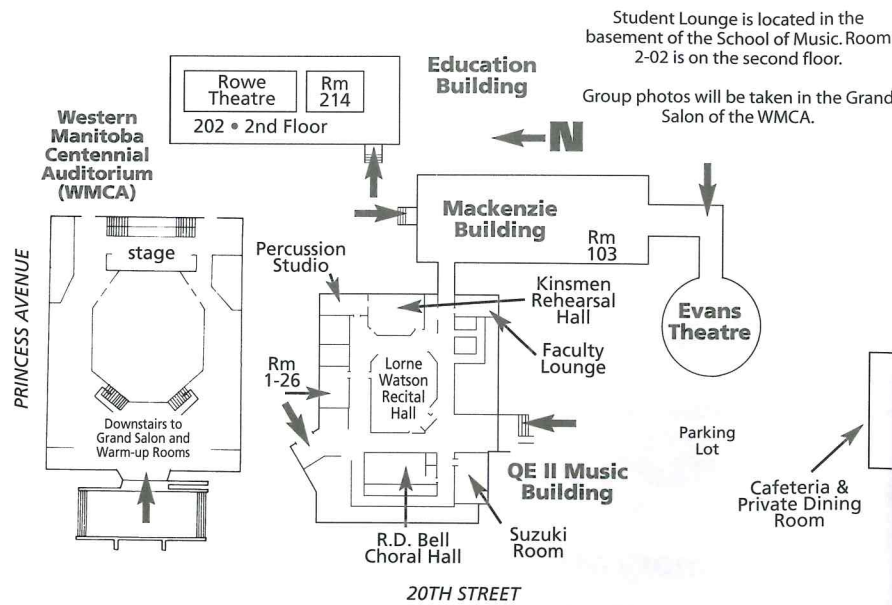

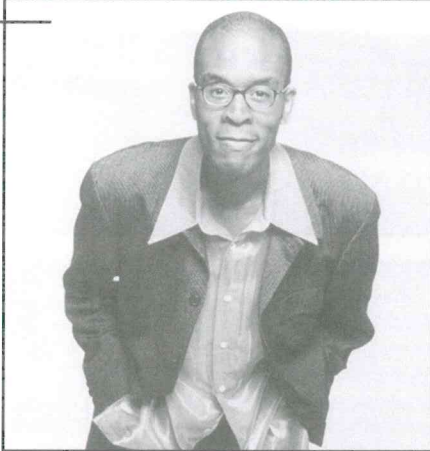

Over the past decade Denzal Sinclair has earned his reputation as Canada's most popular male jazz vocalist. Based in Vancouver, he has graced the stages of numerous high-profile international jazz festivals in North America and Europe, performed with Symphony Orchestras, and starred in his own one hour television special for BRAVO! Sinclair was also a feature vocalist for the prominent Count Basie Orchestra, and recently co-produced a musical tribute to the great Nat King Cole. His albums include *I Waited For You* featuring such musical greats as tenor saxophonist Jimmy Heath, pianist Richard Wyands and bassist Neil Swainson; *Mona Lisa*, a collection of duets with guitarist/arranger Bill Coon; and his latest venture *i found love*.

IAJE held an international collegiate competition in order to select the 2001 Sisters in Jazz Sextet which had its debut performance at IAJE's annual conference in New York City.



As a result of the success that this particular group experienced at the 2001 conference, they were invited to embark on an international tour the following summer. The sextet has participated in major jazz festivals in Washington, D.C., Holland, Austria, France, Spain, Finland, Turkey, Brazil, and Peru.

ORV ANDERSON - INSTRUMENTAL

Orv Anderson is Director of Bands at Fort Richmond Collegiate in Winnipeg, Manitoba. His bands at Fort Richmond have established a strong tradition of excellence and have won national championships in both the Canadian Stage Band Festival and the Canadian Concert Band Festival. In Winnipeg, Orv has been a founder of the Manitoba Band Association, the Manitoba High School Honour Band, the Solo and Ensemble Festival and the Winnipeg Wind Ensemble from 1985-1994. He has also taught graduate courses at the University of Manitoba.

PAT BELLIVEAU - SAXOPHONE

Pat Belliveau is on the faculty at both the University of Calgary, teaching jazz saxophone, jazz harmony and jazz improvisation, and Bishop Carroll High School as a teaching assistant of instrumental music. In addition, he has a number of private students and is active as a clinician/adjudicator. JOHN CHALMERS - INSTRUMENTAL

John Chalmers currently teaches music at Central Peel Secondary School in Brampton, and is also the music director at North Star United Church and vocal coach for the Toronto All-Star Big Band. He is the Coordinator of the Ontario Vocal Jazz Festival and Vice Chairman of the Canadian Choral Festival. Trish currently is head of the vocal department at Humber College where she conducts the award winning Humber College Vocal Jazz Ensemble and has earned recognition for her excellence in teaching. She is also head of vocal jazz for the National Music Camp's Jazz Program.

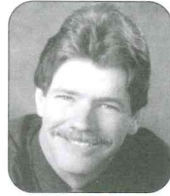

RAY DILLARD - PERCUSSION

Ray Dillard received his Masters degree from West Texas State University. He has instructed and served as Director of Percussion Studies at several universities in Texas and is an active performer and recording artist. Ray has performed all over the world with the World Drum Ensemble and recording credits include Grammy and Juno nominated projects with numerous artists and ensembles from the United States, South America, Europe, Japan and Canada. VICTOR LOPEZ - TRUMPET

Victor Lopez is a highly acclaimed composer, arranger, conductor and adjudicator, and has achieved success in music performance, education, and administration. 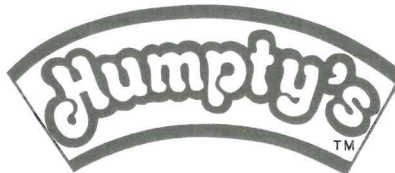

TERRY O'MAHOONEY - PERCUSSION
Terry O'Mahoney is currently Associate Professor at St. Francis Xavier University where he teaches jazz and orchestral percussion, history, and coaches large and small jazz ensembles. Terry has appeared with such jazz greats as Bud Shank, Phil Woods, Oliver Jones, Ed Bickert, and Marvin Stamm to name just a few. A writer and composer, Terry is also an editor for *Percussive Notes* magazine. He is active as a performer, clinician and adjudicator at music festivals throughout the US and Canada and has also performed in Japan and Brazil.

PAUL READ - PIANO
Paul Read is Professor of Music and Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Toronto. Paul is active as a performer, composer, and music educator. He has recorded several CDs and has many published arrangements and compositions including three volumes of transcriptions of Oscar Peterson's compositions and improvisations. Paul has adjudicated at festivals and presented workshops throughout Canada since 1975. He is on the summer jazz faculty of the Saskatchewan Jazz Camp and was founder and

coordinator of the National Music Camp Jazz Program in Ontario from 1987-2001.

KATE REID - VOCAL
Dr. Kate Reid is head of vocal jazz at Cypress College, California. She holds a Doctorate degree in Jazz Performance from the University of Miami. Kate has performed and recorded for several prestigious events and with many jazz greats including Bobby McFerrin and Joe Williams, Jon Secada and Quincy Jones. Kate is also in demand as a jazz vocalist in Tokyo, Japan where she has performed during the summer months the last four years.

RUSS WEIL - VOCAL
Russ Weil is the artistic director of Hamilton's student-based All Star Jazz Band. This group has an impressive record, having been twice named the most outstanding band in its class in Canada and the recipient of numerous awards. To date the band has recorded six CDs and has been invited to perform at many world-renowned jazz festivals and other prestigious events. Mr. Weil holds a B.A. in Music from McMaster University, an M.Ed from the University of Toronto in curriculum design and an A.R.C.T. in Vocal Performance from the Royal Conservatory of Toronto. He is the recipient of many awards for his teaching excellence.

2003 BJJ Scholarships & Awards

The Brandon Jazz Festival is proud to announce several scholarships that will be awarded in partnership with our generous sponsors at the 2003 Brandon Jazz Festival, March 20-22.

THE PRESIDENT'S BRANDON JAZZ FESTIVAL SCHOLARSHIP covers full tuition for one year at the School of Music, Brandon University and will be awarded to an entering student who delivers an outstanding performance in a live audition during the Brandon Jazz Festival. Applicants for the 2003 award must be eligible to attend Brandon University in the fall of 2003 and must gain admission to the School of Music. THE MUSIC GROUP INSTRUMENT SCHOLARSHIP. The Music Group will award a new professional level instrument to the recipient of the President's Brandon Jazz Festival Scholarship. TMG is proud to partner with Brandon University in recognizing an outstanding young musician in attendance at the Brandon Jazz Festival. In the event that the winner plays an instrument that is not manufactured by The Music Group all efforts will be made to find a suitable substitute.

RICO REEDS SCHOLARSHIP. Rico Reeds will donate a reed package worth over \$1000.00 retail to the school band program whose reed section is chosen as most outstanding by the adjudicators. Rico is proud to support the students and schools participating in the 2003 Brandon Jazz Festival.

INTERNATIONAL MUSIC CAMP SCHOLARSHIP. The International Music Camp will award two full camp scholarships, one each to an outstanding instrumental soloist and outstanding vocal soloist, as selected by the adjudicators. The recipients must use the scholarship to attend the respective jazz week at the camp held at the Peace Garden on the border of Manitoba and North Dakota during the summer of 2003. Two \$100 scholarships to the University of Manitoba Summer Jazz Camp will be awarded to outstanding vocalists, as selected by the adjudicators.
