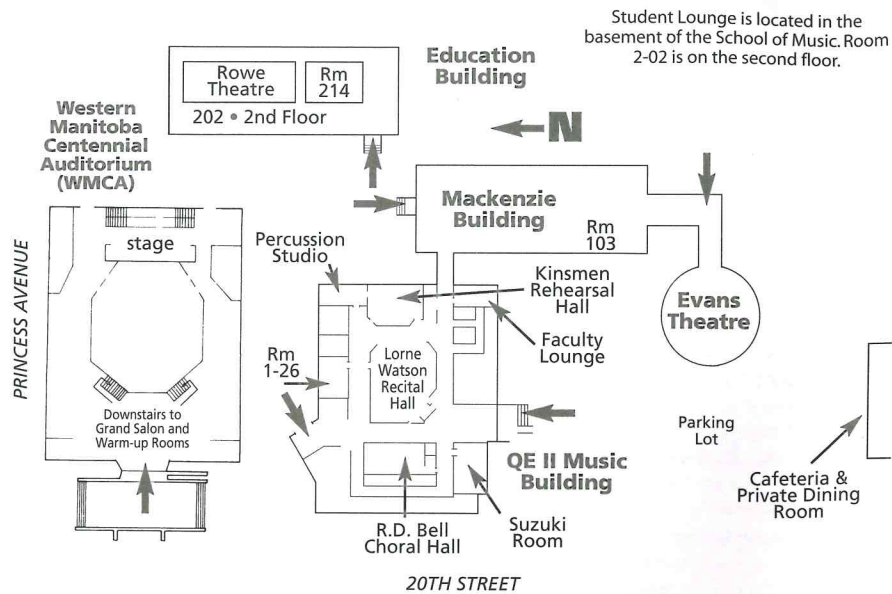

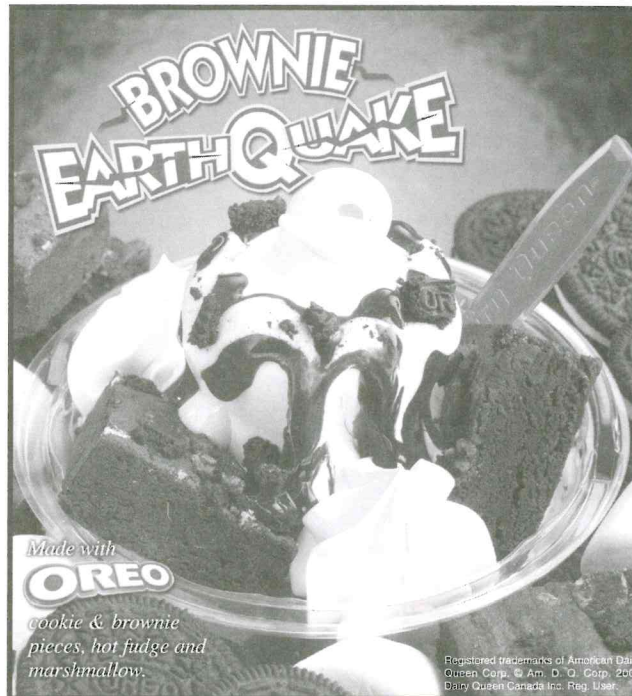

Time Warp is the successful Toronto based jazz quartet of Barry Elmes (drums), Al Henderson (bass), Kelly Jefferson (tenor and soprano sax) and Kevin Turcotte (trumpet and flugelhorn). Formed in 1980 by co-leaders Elmes and Henderson as a vehicle for writing and performing original music, the band became a hit, releasing five recordings between 1982 and 1992 (garnering three Juno nominations), and led the way for many other Canadian jazz groups. Time Warp forged a unique style and original repertoire, drawing on musical and cultural influences from around the world, long before the term "world music" was widely known. Today, while still firmly rooted in the long tradition of improvised jazz music, the band's vast repertoire has grown to include original compositions influenced by the rhythms and harmonic structures of West African music, Japanese koto music, Hungarian folk songs, North American urban funk rhythms, New Orleans parade music, country waltzes and more. Time Warp's distinctive creative musical approach and energy has earned them much recognition and many awards. We are thrilled to feature them at this year's Brandon Jazz Festival.

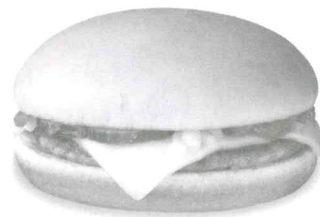

ORV ANDERSON - INSTRUMENTAL

Orv Anderson is Director of Bands at Fort Richmond Collegiate in Winnipeg, Manitoba. His bands at Fort Richmond have established a strong tradition of excellence and have won national championships in both the Canadian Stage Band Festival and the Canadian Concert Band Festival. In Winnipeg, Orv has been a founder of the Manitoba Band Association, the Manitoba High School Honour Band, the Solo and Ensemble Festival and the Winnipeg Wind Ensemble from 1985-1994. He has also taught graduate courses at the University of Manitoba.

DEIDRE BAIRD - VOCAL JAZZ

Originally from Regina, Saskatchewan, Deidre is presently Director of Choral activities and Fine Arts Department Head at D.W. Poppy Secondary School in Langley, B.C. She has had extensive experience working as a music educator at the elementary, secondary, and post-secondary levels in Saskatchewan, Ontario, and British Columbia for the past fifteen years. Her choral ensembles are consistently recognized for their superior performance standards. The 2003 D.W. Poppy Senior Chamber Choir holds the B.C. Matheson Trophy, emblematic of outstanding work in the choral art.

RUSS BAIRD - VOCAL JAZZ

Russ Baird is director of bands and jazz ensembles at D.W. Poppy Secondary School and past-Chairman of the Canadian Choral Festival. The Ontario Vocal Festival, which he founded, is the largest high school choral festival in North America. He is the past-Canadian Coordinator for the IAJE and the first chairman of Jazz Canada. He was elected to the MusicFest Hall of Fame in 1991 in recognition of his contribution to music education across Canada. Mr. Baird has been a frequent lecturer in music pedagogy and has taught at several Canadian Universities and at the University of Northern Colorado in the jazz studies department.

CRAIG BRENNAN - TROMBONE

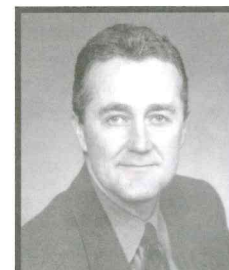
Craig Brennan is a trombonist and educator currently teaching at Victoria School for the Arts and at Grant MacEwan College in Edmonton. Craig is the director of the Edmonton Littlebirds Big Band as well as the director of the Jazzworks Music Festival, both sponsored by the Edmonton Yardbird Suite. A graduate of the New England Conservatory, Craig has worked and studied with Sam Rivers, Gunther Schuller, George Russell, and George Garzone among others. BILL COON - GUITAR

Bill Coon has been performing professionally for twenty years. He began his musical career in Montreal where he was a long time member of the Andre White Band and performed with the jazz chamber group Indigo, as well as his own jazz trio. Bill is presently on the faculty of Capilano College in North Vancouver where he teaches jazz guitar and composition. He performs with many artists and with his own ensemble, The Bill Coon Trio, which has recently released their debut CD, *Speakeasy*. He has written for the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra, the National Arts Centre Orchestra, the Norwegian Radio Orchestra and the Woody Herman Band. His long-time musical partnership with Denzal Sinclair has produced three CD recordings, a number of television specials, several radio shows and many performances throughout Canada.

SANDRO DOMINELLI - PERCUSSION

Sandro Dominelli is a well-known name in the Canadian music scene. He maintains a busy performing/recording career, as well as teaching and working as a clinician. He has shared the stage with many noted musicians and has been profiled in *Drums Etc. Magazine* which describes him as a "drummer extraordinaire." Sandro has worked with the Edmonton, Red Deer and Winnipeg Symphony Orchestras, and has performed in many Theatre productions as well as shows with Decidedly Jazz Danceworks in Calgary. For the past two years, Sandro has been the Artist in Residence for the music program at Victoria High School. Sandro is proud to endorse Yamaha Drums, Sabian Cymbals and Vic Firth sticks. His appearance at the 2004 Brandon Jazz Festival is made possible through a grant from Yamaha.

GORDON FOOTE - JAZZ STUDIES

Gordon Foote is currently an Associate Professor of Jazz Studies at McGill University in Montreal, Quebec, where he serves as Chair of the Department of Performance. Professor Foote is the coordinator of the McGill Jazz Orchestras, and directs McGill Jazz

Orchestra I. Under his direction, the ensemble has performed throughout the United States, France, England, Ireland, Mexico and Canada. It also has been featured on radio and television in Europe and Canada, and has released seven CDs. Gordon has served as the Quebec representative to the IAJE, and as President of Jazz Canada.

JEFF JOHNSON - TRUMPET

Jeff Johnson is currently Director of Music Education at Lord Selkirk Regional Comprehensive Secondary School where he is recognized for setting high standards, instilling an expectation of excellence as well as enthusiastically sharing his love of music and the arts with each of his students. Jeff performs as both a freelance musician as well as the full time lead trumpet player for both the Winnipeg Jazz Orchestra and the Ron Paley Big Band. He is an active clinician, guest conductor and adjudicator and a former member of the Jazz Faculty at International Music Camp.

STEVE KIRBY - BASS

Steve Kirby has recently accepted the position as the Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Manitoba. Since his arrival in Winnipeg, Steve has given many jazz clinics and is performing with a great many of Manitoba's finest musicians and groups including the WJO and Ground Swell. Steve Kirby's career as a jazz musician spans over 25 years of performance collaboration with many of the finest artists in the field, both in North America and abroad. He has performed extensively and recorded with some of the most high profile jazz artists on the scene today. Steve is in the process of completing a bass instruction book and is performing and writing music for his own group. He has given workshops and clinics with the Carnegie Hall Jazz Outreach Program, as well as Lincoln Center Jazz Educators. Steve was on the faculty of the F.A.M.E. Academy Jazz Camp at Princeton University and also taught in New York City.

EARL MACDONALD - PIANO

Pianist Earl MacDonald lives jazz as a performer, composer and educator. A native of Winnipeg, Earl currently is the Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Connecticut. He is dedicated to music education, participating as a clinician, guest conductor and teacher at summer camps in addition to his position at UConn. MacDonald's current musical focus is on composing and arranging music for larger jazz ensembles. Such compositions are featured on the recent *UConn Jazz featuring Earl MacDonald CD*, recorded by the University of Connecticut Jazz Ensembles. A studio recording with his new sextet, the Earl MacDonald 6, is scheduled in 2004.

JIM MACKAY - INSTRUMENTAL

Jim MacKay is a 35-year veteran of teaching and directing bands in the United States and Canada. Prior to his retirement in 1999, Jim served as director of bands at Silver Heights Collegiate in Winnipeg where his concert bands and jazz ensembles gained national and international recognition for their excellence in performance. Jim has been the recipient of numerous awards including the "Prime Minister of Canada Award for Teaching Excellence" and, most recently, the "Jazz Educator of the Year," presented by Jazz Winnipeg.

CHRIS MCLAUGHLIN - VOCAL JAZZ

Chris McLaughlin has taught High School choral and vocal jazz music for thirty years. Groups under Chris's direction have distinguished themselves with performances on CBC radio, concerts at MusicFest Canada and the Ontario Vocal Festival, appearances with the Niagara Symphony Orchestra, a mainstage performance at the renowned Niagara Wine Festival, and at the Metro Toronto Convention Centre. Chris's current group Fusion has won several outstanding performance awards and has been invited to perform at several festivals, events and conferences, including the International Association of Jazz Education's annual conference in Toronto in January 2003.

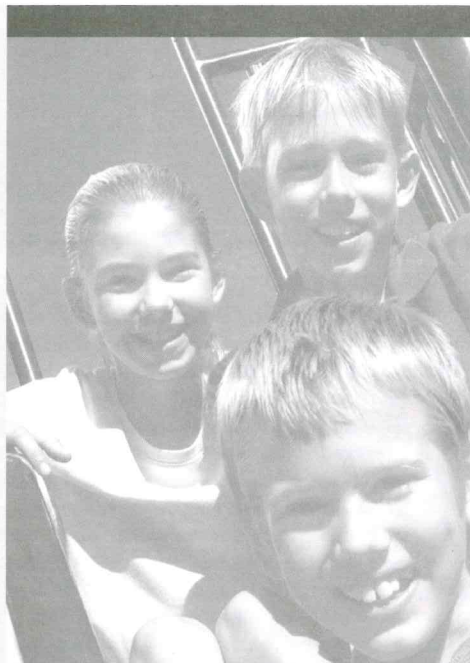
DAVE MCMURDO - TROMBONE

Dave McMurdo has performed as a respected sideman in Rob McConnell's Boss Brass, and the lead trombone player in Nimmons 'N' Nine Plus Six. Since 1984, he has been a full-time faculty member in the Music Department at Mohawk College. A dedicated composer/ player/clinician, he participates in numerous clinics and music festivals throughout the year. Dave frequently conducts clinics for Yamaha Canada. He studied composition with Bob Brookmeyer in New York City and then formed the Dave McMurdo Jazz Orchestra to provide a voice for his music. Dave's group has toured extensively, made several CD's, received a Juno Award nomination and were named Canada's outstanding jazz orchestra by *The Jazz Report* magazine.

DEAN MCNEILL - TRUMPET

Dean McNeill is an Associate Professor at the University of Saskatchewan. He has performed with the likes of Tommy Banks, Dan Hearle, Campbell Ryga and Bob Mintzer, as well as with the Banff Centre for the Performing Arts Jazz Orchestra and the Vancouver Jazz Orchestra. He has performed on thirteen CDs spanning the jazz, classical, commercial and educational fields. He has written and arranged commissioned pieces for jazz ensembles and is involved as a clinician/performer/ lecturer at a number of Canadian music festivals, conferences and conventions. 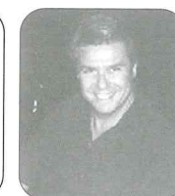

JIM MAIR - SAXOPHONE

A native of Winnipeg, Manitoba, Jim Mair is currently Director of Instrumental Music at Kansas Community College and Artistic Director for The Kansas City Jazz Orchestra. Jim has served on the faculty at the College of Southern Idaho, the International Music Camp and the Charlie Parker Academy of the Arts. In addition, he has served as a staff writer for the *Saxophone Journal* and is currently an artist/clinician for the Selmer Instrument Company. Mair has released four CDs which have garnered critical acclaim, earning him profiles in *Down Beat*, *Jazz Times*, *Coda* and *Jam* magazines. In 2002, Jim was inducted into the Who's Who of American teachers. Jim Mair's appearance at the 2004 Brandon Jazz Festival has been made possible through a grant from Selmer.

RÉJEAN MAROIS - VOCAL JAZZ

Réjean Marois currently teaches vocal improvisation, arranging and composition, and conducting at Capilano College for the Jazz Studies Program. He conducts two vocal jazz ensembles (Nite Cap and Capital Jazz) as well as the A band at the College — groups which have performed with many international renowned jazz artists. Before moving to B.C., Réjean worked in Québec as a performer, composer, arranger, trombonist, publisher and educator. For the past fifteen years he has been in demand throughout Canada and the U.S. as a clinician, adjudicator, conductor, music advisor and arranger. Marois publishes original works for jazz band, jazz choir, concert band and concert choir, and is also a staff writer for the University of Northern Colorado Jazz Press.
