BILL COON - GUITAR

Bill Coon has been performing professionally for twenty years. He began his musical career in Montreal where he was a long time member of the Andre White Band. He now lives and works in Vancouver where he performs and records with many artists as well as his own ensemble, The Bill Coon Trio. His long-time musical partnership with Denzal Sinclair has produced three CD recordings, a number of television specials, several radio shows and many performances throughout Canada. Coon is also considered a composer and arranger of note and has written for the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra, the National Arts Centre Orchestra, the Norwegian Radio Orchestra and the Woody Herman Band.

DAVE CROSS - VOCAL

Dave Cross, composer, arranger, clinician, guest conductor and music educator, is highly respected for his wealth of knowledge and experiences in the field of music education. He is presently the Director of Vocal Jazz Studies at the University of Washington School of Music, where he conducts three jazz choirs and teaches pedagogy classes in all areas of vocal jazz. Cross is in demand as a clinician and guest conductor, and has conducted honour choirs throughout the United States

and Canada. He was a founding member and served for 25 years on the faculty of the Frank DeMiero Jazz Camp. His arrangements and compositions, more than 120 in the vocal jazz idiom, are published by UNC Press and Sound Music Publications.

JOHN DAVIS - TRUMPET

John Davis, Director of Jazz Studies at the University of Colorado, is an active clinician, performer and conductor. At University of Colorado he has taught courses in jazz history, jazz administration and pedagogy, big band, combo, vocal jazz, and jazz techniques, a program which, during the past three years, has been recognized with 9 *Down Beat Magazine* Student Music Awards. His Jazz Ensemble I was recognized as one of the nation's outstanding big bands by *Down Beat Magazine* in 2003. Davis has served as guest conductor for numerous honour and all-state ensembles and maintains a busy schedule as a clinician and adjudicator for festivals throughout the United States and Canada. He has authored a text, *Jazz Nuances for Trumpet*, from OmniTone Press.

RAY DILLARD - PERCUSSION

head of Percussion and MIDI Technology at San Jacinto College in Houston, Texas. He currently resides in Toronto, Canada, where he works full-time with the percussion ensemble NEXUS and is active playing and producing. Recording credits include Grammy- and Juno-nominated projects with artists and ensembles from the United States, South America, Europe, Japan, and Canada. Ray keeps busy composing, commissioning and premiering new works for percussion. His work can be heard on recordings spanning styles as varied as Renaissance, classical, jazz, rock, Contemporary Christian, Tejano and experimental music.

DAVID DUNN - BASS

David Dunn is a bassist and educator with an extensive background in both areas. His performance credits cross the spectrum from classical to jazz, popular and folk music. A university and college professor since 1991, he is currently on the faculty at the Southwestern (Iowa) Community College School for Music Vocations where he teaches music theory, ear training, improvisation and directs combos. He received his Bachelor of Music degree in voice performance from Augustana College, his Master of Music degree in string bass performance from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst, and did extensive post-graduate work in performance and jazz pedagogy at the University of Northern Colorado.

KEN GOLD - SAXOPHONE

Ken Gold stays busy with a variety of playing, recording and teaching activities. He is a regular member with some of Winnipeg's finest ensembles, including the Ron Paley Big Band, the Winnipeg Jazz Orchestra, Papa Mambo, the Roy/Kramer band and the Dave Lawton Society Band. His own album, *North End Shuffle*, airs regularly on both CBC stations and Cool FM 99.1. Ken is consistently involved with young musicians and saxophonists, both through his own teaching studio and workshops throughout the region. He teaches jazz ensembles and jazz saxophone at the University of Manitoba.

KELSLEY GRANT - TROMBONE

Kelsley Grant completed his Masters in Jazz and Commercial Music at Manhattan School of Music in New York. He became the trombonist for Maynard Ferguson's Big Bop Nouveau and spent several months touring the United States and Europe before returning to Montreal where he is currently teaching at McGill, free-lancing, recording and composing. Kelsley co-leads The Jefferson-Grant Quintet along with Toronto saxophonist Kelly Jefferson. The quintet's first recording won an Opus Award for Jazz Recording of the Year. Since then, the group has been touring extensively throughout Canada and maintains a profile as one of the country's most active and recognizable young ensembles.

GARY HOBBS - DRUMS

Gary Hobbs has played professionally for three decades and appears on over 40 recordings. He played with The Stan Kenton Orchestra and has performed with many artists at venues such as Carnegie Hall, Royal Festival Hall, Tivoli Garden, Kennedy Center and Wolf Trap. Gary has also played at scores of festivals and clubs all over the world. He is very active in Jazz Education, teaching at The University of Oregon and traveling all over the US doing clinics, concerts and jazz camps with the help of Zildjian Cymbal Company and Yamaha Drum Company.

KELLY JEFFERSON - SAXOPHONE

Kelly Jefferson has a Masters degree from Manhattan School of Music in New York City and has performed with many renowned jazz artists. He toured extensively with legendary trumpet player Maynard Ferguson and his Big Bop Nouveau Band. Along with trombonist Kelsley Grant, Kelly co-leads the Jefferson-Grant Quintet, winners of the Opus Award for Jazz Album of the Year for their 1999 debut release *JGQ*. The band has performed across Canada and was a nominee at the 2003 National Jazz Awards for Acoustic Group of the Year. Kelly served on the Jazz Studies faculty at McGill University from 1995-1998 and presently teaches at Humber College in

Toronto. He has given numerous workshops throughout Canada and the United States and works with many of Toronto's finest musicians. Kelly is also saxophonist with Time Warp, winners of the 2003 Independent Music Award for Jazz Album of the Year *Warp IX*.

JEFF JENKINS - PIANO

Jeff Jenkins is a musician, writer, producer, and engineer in the Denver area. He has several CD releases under his own name, the most recent ones for trumpeter-composer John McNeil, *Sleep Won't Come*, and for saxophone legend Phil Woods, *Phil Woods and Carl Saunders Play the Music of Henry Mancini*. Jeff spends most of his days at his new recording studio, Mile High Music, and is often gigging at night. He has also worked with the likes of Freddie Hubbard, Eddie Harris, David Fathead Newman, Marlana Shaw, Pete Townshend, Dave Pietro, and Brazilian singer Joyce.

KEN KRAINTZ - VOCAL

Ken Kraitz holds both a BA in Education and Masters in Composition degrees. He is the co-founder and assistant director of Sound Music Publications, where he works as primary arranger and composer. His musical background exemplifies his wide variety of artistic qualities. Ken is in demand as a clinician and guest conductor.

LAURIE CAPPELLO-MARCY - VOCAL

Laurie Cappello-Marcy has been the Director of Vocal Music at Cascade High School in Everett, Washington for the past three years. During her 21 years of teaching, Laurie has taught vocal and instrumental music at all levels, including eleven years at Evergreen Middle School in Everett, WA, where her vocal jazz choirs were honoured three times by *downBeat Magazine*. Currently, Laurie is working toward completion of her Doctorate of Musical Arts degree in Choral Conducting. A professional vocalist and outstanding educator, Laurie is in demand as a clinician/adjudicator at choral and vocal jazz festivals throughout the Pacific Northwest, California, and Canada.

CHRIS MCLAUGHLIN - VOCAL

Chris McLaughlin has taught high school choral and vocal jazz music for thirty years. Groups under Chris' direction have distinguished themselves with performances on CBC-Radio, concerts at MusicFest Canada and the Ontario Vocal Festival, appearances with the Niagara Symphony Orchestra, a mainstage performance at the renowned Niagara Wine Festival, and at the Metro Toronto Convention Centre. Chris' current group Fusion has won several outstanding performance awards and has been invited to perform at several festivals, events and conferences, including the 2003 International Association of Jazz Educator's annual conference held in Toronto.

DALE NORMANDEAU - GUITAR

Dale Normandeau is a prominent music educator in Manitoba, teaching instrumental music at Crocus Plains High School in Brandon. Dale completed his undergraduate studies in music education at Brandon University. He also maintains a busy freelance schedule performing as a jazz guitarist. Dale is also a faculty member at the University of Manitoba Jazz Camp where he teaches small ensembles and guitar masterclasses.

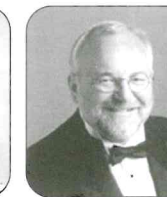

BOB REBAGLIATI - INSTRUMENTAL

For over 30 years, Bob Rebagliati has directed many award-winning junior and senior high school ensembles in both concert band and in the North Vancouver School District. As a director, clinician and adjudicator, Rebagliati has travelled throughout Canada and has taught at numerous summer music camps. Throughout his career, he has received several awards to recognize his outstanding contributions to the music education community and has been acknowledged for his dedication and insistence on excellence. He currently resides in North Vancouver where he is a freelance music educator, pianist and percussionist/drummer.

JERRY STEINHOLTZ - PERCUSSION

Jerry Steinholtz was introduced to Latin percussion by several black Cuban players while living in Los Angeles. Through their guidance, he developed his knowledge and skills as a Latin percussionist. Jerry also befriended some percussionists from Brazil, who helped him develop his skills in the Brazilian style of playing. Because of Jerry's extensive playing experience and insight into the music business at all levels, he was asked to teach Latin and Brazilian hand percussion at California State University, Northridge (CSUN) and has done so for the last eighteen years. Currently, he is on faculty at Hamilton High School Academy of the Arts in Los Angeles, and is Co-Director of Percussion at the internationally-known Los Angeles Music Academy in Pasadena, California. Jerry is involved in clinics and master classes throughout the world and has been a consultant for numerous percussion manufacturers, including Toca, Remo and Calato, in product development and design.

BRAD TURNER - TRUMPET

Brad Turner's phenomenal talents as a trumpeter, pianist, drummer and composer make him one of Canada's most-in-demand musicians. Brad has performed and recorded extensively and, in 1999, won a Juno Award for Best Contemporary Jazz Album recognizing his work in the internationally established electric jazz group Metalwood. Winner of National Jazz Awards for Jazz Trumpeter of the Year (1999) and Jazz Composer of the Year (2000 and 2002), Brad's most recent release is the Juno nominated *Live at the Cellar* featuring Seamus Blake, with new releases from both his quartet and piano trio due out this year. Brad was nominated for Musician of the Year (1999) by the West Coast Music Association.

RUSS WEIL - INSTRUMENTAL

Russ Weil is the founder and artistic director of Hamilton's student-based All Star Jazz Band. This group has an impressive record, having been twice named the most outstanding band in its class in Canada and the recipient of numerous awards as well as invitations to many of the world's greatest jazz festivals. To date the band has recorded six CDs. Mr. Weil holds a B.A. in Music from McMaster University, an M.Ed. from the University of Toronto in curriculum design, and an A.R.C.T. in Vocal Performance from the Royal Conservatory of Toronto. He is the recipient of many awards for excellence in teaching.



OUTSTANDING TRUMPET PLAYER AWARD


