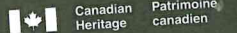

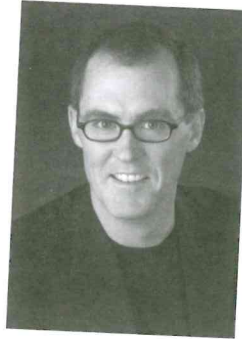

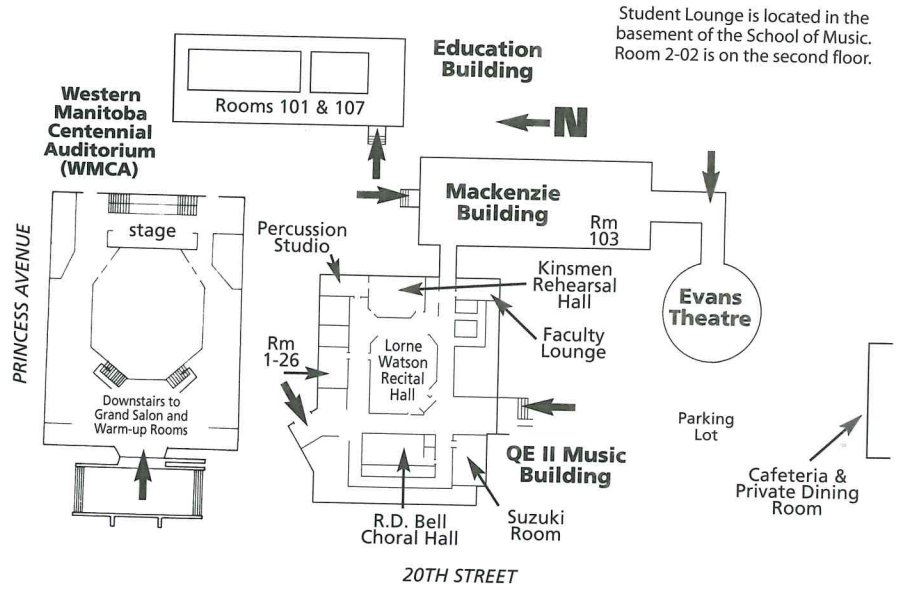

HEATHER BAMBRICK (vocal)

Heather Bambrick is currently a vocal instructor in the Jazz Studies Department at the University of Toronto Faculty of Music and is also active as a freelance clinician. Heather was a founding member and lead soloist of the Toronto-based Vocal Jazz/Pop ensemble The Beehive Singers, performing regularly to "standing-room only" audiences and repeat sold-out engagements.

In 1999, The Beehive Singers released their debut self-titled CD to critical national acclaim and in 2000, they were awarded Best Vocal Group by Jazz Report Magazine. Heather has headlined at some of Canada's most-renowned jazz and concert events and has recorded a number of concerts for CBC Radio. In 2003, Heather released her debut solo CD, *It's About Time*, which was nominated for Jazz Recording of the Year at the 2004 East Coast Music Awards. In that same month, she was named Vocalist of the Year at the 2004 National Jazz Awards.

WILLIAM CARN (trombone)

William Carn has emerged as one of Canada's leading contemporary jazz composers and performers. He has performed and recorded with various jazz artists and was nominated Trombonist of the Year for the National Jazz Awards in 2004 and 2005. William currently leads the William Carn Quintet, a band featuring some of Canada's finest musicians. In 2005, the band released their first recording, *OtherStories*. Currently, William is a member of several ensembles and enjoys a diverse freelance career in Toronto having worked with classical ensembles, musicals and numerous studio and concert engagements for commercial artists. He is also a Yamaha artist/clinician and teaches for the University of Toronto's Jazz Program.

COREY CHRISTIANSEN (guitar)

Corey Christiansen received his Bachelor's degree from Utah State University where he received many honours and awards including the Outstanding Music Student Award and Outstanding Guitarist Award. In 1999, after receiving his Master's Degree from the University of South Florida, Corey became the adjunct guitar instructor at USF. In this position, Corey became well-versed in the abilities and needs of jazz guitar students and ensembles. In 2001, he joined Mel Bay Publications as Senior Music Editor and advisor to Product Development, and currently has over forty publications with Mel Bay, including the increasingly popular Essential Jazz Lines series. Corey continues to write, teach and perform. He endorses Buscarino Guitars, Clarus amplifiers and Raezer's Edge speaker cabinets.

TRISH COLTER (vocal)

Trish Colter has performed as a professional vocalist since 1976. In 2003, she was nominated for a National Jazz Award as Vocalist of the Year. Trish performs regularly in Toronto jazz clubs, has appeared at many jazz concerts and festivals, and has been featured on CBC radio. She is a lyricist, an accomplished arranger, and a well-known music educator. Trish is the vocalist with the Humber College Faculty Jazz Ensemble and is full-time head of the vocal department, conducting the award winning Humber College Vocal Jazz. In 2000, Trish was awarded the Humber College Distinguished Faculty Award and in 2001 the NISOD Award of Excellence in Teaching. In 1998, Trish, along with pianist Paul Read, released her first CD, *The Dance Never Ends*. Their second CD, *At Long Last Love*, was released in 2002 to rave reviews. Her recordings have had extensive airplay on jazz stations all across North America.

SCOTT LEITHEAD (vocal)

Scott Leithead is the founder and artistic director of the Kokopelli Choir Association, the T.I.M.E. Vocal Ensembles and the Brailtones Choir for persons with disabilities. His choirs have been featured at regional, national and international spotlight performances and on over thirteen CDs over the past seven years. Mr. Leithead is in frequent demand as clinician and guest conductor at events across North America. He is the recipient of the Syncrude Award for Innovative Artistic Direction at the 2002 Edmonton Mayor's Awards for Business and the Arts. He is also the recipient of the 2001 Con Spirito Award presented by the Alberta Choral Federation. In 1996, he received the Edmonton Salute to Excellence Award for outstanding educational work with youth.

JEHANBAKHSH (JOHN) JASAVALA (trombone)

Jehanbakhsh (John) Jasavala is a sessional instructor in the music faculties of the University of Toronto and the University of Western Ontario. He holds a Diploma in Jazz Studies from Humber College, a B.F.A. (trombone) from York University and an M.Mus. (trombone) from the University of Michigan, as well as a B. Ed. from the University of Windsor. John has taught trombone and led jazz ensembles at Lakehead University and the University of Windsor. At the University of Western Ontario, he teaches trombone and chamber music. At the University of Toronto, he teaches trombone, chamber music and music education courses, and leads a music education-oriented jazz ensemble.

In the classical world, John has held the position of Principal Trombone with both the Windsor and Thunder Bay Symphony Orchestras, and plays as a freelance musician with several other orchestras in Ontario and Michigan, including Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony Orchestra, Orchestra London, and The Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

KIRK MARCY (vocal)

Kirk Marcy is an active writer and arranger of vocal jazz music. He has served as guest conductor for numerous All-State Jazz Choirs and is in great demand as a clinician/adjudicator at jazz festivals throughout the United States and Canada. Kirk brought honours to himself and his programs at Lake Washington High School with the 1985 *DownBeat Magazine* award for Best High School Vocal Jazz Ensemble in North America. In 1988, he became the Director of Soundsation, the internationally acclaimed vocal jazz ensemble at Edmonds Community College which, in 2001, was honoured by *DownBeat Magazine* as one of the Outstanding College Vocal Jazz Ensembles. In addition to his duties with Soundsation, Kirk also directs the Edmonds Community College Symphonic Choir. He sings with Male Ensemble Northwest (M.E.N.) and is also a member of Just 4 Kicks, an *a cappella* vocal jazz quartet based on the West Coast.

ALDO MAZZA (drums/percussion)

Aldo Mazza is an internationally-recognized drummer-percussionist, recording artist, clinician and educator. A member of internationally-acclaimed percussion quartet Répercussion for over 25 years, Aldo has gone around the world twice with his ensemble, performed countless concerts and made many television appearances. Aldo is a freelance artist with over 100 CDs and sound tracks to his credit. He regularly appears as a drum-set artist and is an active clinician for several percussion companies. Aldo is the founder and artistic director of the KoSA International Percussion Workshops and Festival for the past ten years (USA & CUBA). He is currently instructor of Percussion at McGill Conservatory of Music in Montréal and the KoSA Academy in Montréal.

DAVE PROZNICK (instrumental)

Dave has 34 years of teaching experience in the public school system. His music program in Surrey, B.C. consisted of eighteen performing groups with three full-time music teachers and over a decade of award-winning bands and individual music students. In 1995, his group won the *Jazz Report Magazine* award for Canadian High School Jazz Program of the Year. Dave has been honoured with several music education achievement awards including the BCMEA Professional Music Educator Award (1995) and the Keith Mann Outstanding Band Director Award (2003). Dave has served as director, coordinator and instructor at Vancouver Summer Jazz Camps over the past 20 years. Although now retired, Dave continues serving as board member of South Surrey/White Rock Arts Council, as coordinator of Pacific Jazz CYMC, and as adjudicator for concert and jazz band festivals across the country.

JODI PROZNICK (bass)

In 1993, after winning the General Motors Award of Excellence as one of the top young musicians in Canada, Jodi Proznick moved from her native White Rock, B.C. to Montreal, where she obtained her B. Mus. from McGill University. In 1998, Jodi was the winner of the IAJE Sisters in Jazz Competition. Since moving to Vancouver in 2000, Jodi has become a top call bassist and has played and recorded with many international jazz stars. In 2004, Jodi won the Galaxie Rising Star Award of the Vancouver International Jazz Festival with her own group, the Jodi Proznick Quartet. Jodi is currently on faculty at Capilano College, at the CYMC Pacific Jazz Workshop and at the New West Summer Jazz Workshop. She has adjudicated and given clinics at various colleges, high schools, and festivals. Jodi also teaches early childhood music classes in the community and is working toward her Master's degree in Art Education at Simon Fraser University.

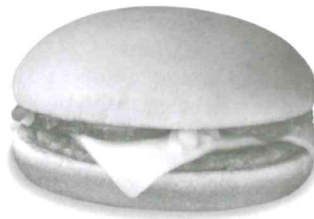
PAUL READ (piano/saxophone)

Paul Read is a jazz pianist, saxophonist, composer and arranger and is Director of Graduate Jazz Studies at the University of Toronto. He developed U of T's Jazz Performance Degree program in 1991 with the aid of Canadian jazz legend, Prof. Phil Nimmons. In 1993, he received the University of Toronto Senior Alumni Award for Innovation in Teaching. Paul has performed extensively and has recorded two CDs as pianist/arranger with jazz singer, Trish Colter, three CDs as a conductor with the University of Toronto 10 O'clock Jazz Orchestra, and a CD with his quartet entitled *The Heart of Summer*, which contains a retrospective collection of his own compositions. Paul has numerous published arrangements and compositions, he works with IAJE's Executive Board, he has adjudicated at festivals and presented workshops throughout Canada since 1975, and was founder and coordinator of the National Music Camp Jazz Program in Ontario from 1987-2001.

DAVE SCHNEIDER (drums/percussion)

David Schneider is an established drumset and percussion educator and the owner of a well-respected educational facility, The Music Cellar. He provides private instruction to over 90 students per week and, along with his teaching team, hosts an annual music festival that features young musicians performing in over 100 bands. David is an active drummer and percussionist in Winnipeg's local music scene, performing in a variety of jazz and rock venues. He is percussionist with the Royal Winnipeg Ballet, the Winnipeg Contemporary Dancers and the Trip Dance Company. For the past seven years, he has been the Manitoba Chapter President of the Percussive Arts Society and has organized and hosted numerous educational events.

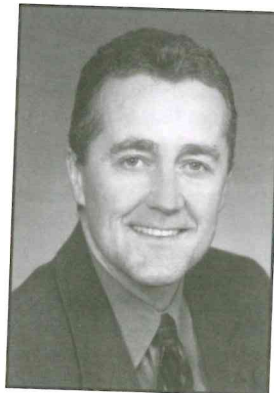

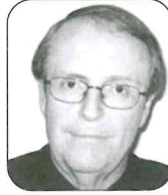

FRED STRIDE (instrumental)

Fred Stride works in many forms of music from jazz to pop to classical. Although he is principally known for his many compositions and arrangements for jazz ensemble, he has also written countless arrangements for various entertainers and performers for almost every musical setting, from chamber ensembles to big bands, concert bands, theatre orchestra and symphony orchestra. His many jazz compositions are played by high school and university bands around the world. Fred is also active as a band leader and guest conductor. He currently leads his own Fred Stride Jazz Orchestra whose performances have been recorded and broadcast on CBC radio and also directs the jazz ensemble and teaches jazz theory and arranging at the University of British Columbia School of Music. He works as a clinician, adjudicator and teacher at various music festivals, summer camps and jazz workshops across the country.

MARTY SUMMERS (instrumental)

Marty Summers is in his 30th year of teaching. He spent 29 years at Aldergrove Community Secondary School and has recently been appointed Instrumental Jazz Director at Trinity Western University in Langley, British Columbia. Aldergrove's ensembles over the years have been recognized locally, nationally and internationally for their musical achievements. In 1997, they were awarded by *Jazz Report Magazine* the Outstanding Secondary School Jazz Program of the Year in Canada. In 2003, Martin was selected for the Secondary Professional Music Educator Award by the British Columbia Music Educator's Association. He serves on the Executive for the British Columbia Music Educator's Association and is the President of IAJE Canada. He continues to give clinics, workshops and to adjudicate throughout western Canada and the Yukon.

TYLER SUMMERS (saxophone)

After recently being named Canada's Galaxie Rising Star in 2004, 25 year-old Tyler Summers has released his first singer-songwriter album on Maxwell Records, entitled *Along For The Ride*. After growing up in Langley, British Columbia, Tyler was awarded numerous Canadian and American scholarships and left home after high school to pursue his career in music at the University of North Texas. While pursuing his music degree at UNT, Tyler was a member of the Grammy-nominated One O'Clock Lab Band, and the leader of The Tyler Summers Trio. The Trio can be heard on their debut album release in 2000 called *Trinity* and on Paul Tynan's CD entitled *Freedom and Jealousy*.

PAUL TYNAN (trumpet)

Paul Tynan is presently Assistant Professor of music at St. Francis Xavier University where he teaches trumpet, arranging, improvisation and directs the St. FX Jazz Ensemble. Paul received his Masters in jazz studies at the University of North Texas. A recording artist for NohJoh Music, his award-winning first album, *NJPT*, received worldwide attention. His second album as a leader, *Freedom and Jealousy*, was released in December 2001. Paul has served on the faculties of the Nova Scotia Honour Jazz Program, University of North Texas Summer Trumpet Workshop, and Crane Youth Music Camp. He has performed with numerous jazz artists, performed at many North American jazz festivals as a soloist, and has received many honours, including an IAJE special citation for outstanding musicianship (2001), *Down Beat Magazine's* student music award for best jazz instrumental soloist (2000), *Down Beat Magazine's* student music award for best small jazz ensemble (2000), and Wichita Jazz Festival outstanding soloist (1999).
