

### PILOTO & KLIMAX

Gerardo Piloto's KLIMAX is by far the most sophisticated and surprisingly original of the main timba projects, representing the heart of Cuban music. As a descendant of a long line of famous Cuban composers and musicians, drummer and composer Gerardo Piloto emerged during the first decade of the history of timba as a major figure. After eight years at the center of the timba

revolution, Piloto decided to start his own band in 1995, and KLIMAX was premiered at the famed La Cecilia, a discotheque on Fifth Avenue. Since then, KLIMAX has toured extensively throughout Europe and South America, and has released five albums. KLIMAX's high-quality music has a universal appeal, with fans all over the globe.



### **FIRST TAKE**

First Take is a five-member vocal jazz ensemble from The School for Music Vocations in Creston, Iowa. They perform in a variety of musical styles including swing, Latin, gospel, and a cappella music. After releasing their first recording "For the Taking"

in February 2005, First Take has recently released its second CD, "Journey Home". In 2005, the group won an award from *Downbeat Magazine* for Best College Vocal Jazz Group. In 2007, they performed at the International Association of Jazz Education Convention in New York. The ensemble is directed by Jeremy Fox.

# **Adjudicators, Artists and Clinicians**


### Lina Allemano

Lina Allemano is a Toronto-based jazz trumpeter, improviser and composer with an established and active career performing, recording and touring internationally. As well as fronting her band Linsa Allemano Four and the improvising group "N", she is also a member of many other active creative groups and appears on over 30 recordings including three if her own critically-acclaimed CDs. Featured as one of the top innovative trumpeters for the future in *Downbeat Magazine*, and winner of the CBC Galaxie Rising Star Award, Lina was also nominated for the 2009 National Jazz Awards Trumpeter of the Year and SOCAN Composer of the Year. Lina Allemano appears at this year's festival with the assistance of Yamaha Canada.



### Dylan Bell

Juno-nominated Dylan Bell is a vocalist, instrumentalist, composer/arranger, music director and producer/engineer. Dylan is a mainstay on the Canadian music scene, having sung with many of Canada's premiere vocal ensembles such as Cadence, Hampton Avenue, the Nathaniel Dett Chorale, and the 1980s-era vocal pop group Retrocity. When he's not singing, he freelances as a keyboard player and bassist. Behind the mixing board, Dylan has produced or engineered several award-winning albums. His work as a composer has also garnered international recognition.



### Jeremy Fox

Jeremy Fox serves as Professor of Music at The School For Music Vocations in Creston, Iowa. He has written for big bands, orchestras, choirs and vocal groups, and his charts are published by UNC Jazz Press, Sound Music Publications, and by his own company, Foxtrot Music. From 1999-2002, Jeremy received eight awards from *Downbeat Magazine*, including ones for Jazz Song, Jazz Arrangement, Studio Engineering, and for his Small Vocal Jazz Groups. Each summer, Jeremy heads the SMV Vocal Jazz Camps – five-day workshops for students, directors and enthusiasts with locations in lowa, Regina and Winnipeg.



### Tia Fuller

When Mack Avenue recording artist Tia Fuller picks up her sax to play, it's easy to see and hear why this artist and teacher, who has a Masters degree in Jazz Pedagogy and Performance from the University of Colorado at Boulder, was selected to be a member of the all-female band touring with R&B star, Beyoncé. Tia has played in various venues throughout the US, Europe, Africa, Asia and Australia. She is a featured soloist on the Beyoncé Experience DVD (Me, Myself and I), and has also appeared on number of major television shows, including The Oprah Winfrey Show, Today Show, and Good Morning America. An accomplished performer in her own right, Tia has recorded three CDs with her quartet and can also be seen performing regularly with a number of bands. As a devoted educator, she presents lectures and teaches ensembles and masterclasses at some of the most respected institutions in the U.S.

### Matt Harris

After graduating with a MM from the Eastman School of Music, Matt Harris toured, wrote and recorded with jazz legends Maynard Ferguson and Buddy Rich. He is now co-director of Jazz Studies at California State University Northridge, and is a current faculty member at Idyllwild Arts summer jazz workshop. Matt is an active clinician, conductor and composer for high schools, colleges and professional bands around the world. With six CDs of original music to his credit, Matt has been fortunate to work with some of the top LA jazz musicians at his weekend 'wine bar gig' (Bellavino) in Westlake, CA, and has played piano and/or written music for some of today's top jazz vocalists. Matt recently teamed up with Tim Ries, current saxophonist for the Rolling Stones, arranging 12 "Stones" tunes for big band.



### Jim Head

Guitarist Jim Head has performed with such notable jazz artists as Kirk MacDonald, Tim Hagans, Sheila Jordan, Lew Tabackin, Rob McConnell, Jane Bunnett, P.J. Perry, Doug Riley, Dave Restivo, Campbell Ryga, Kieran Overs, Jim Vivian, Andrew Downing, David Virelles, Steve Slagle, Kelly Jefferson, Lina Allemano, Chris Tarry, Pat LaBarbera, Hugh Fraser, Steve Wallace, and many others. He has performed in festivals, concerts and clubs across Canada, the U.S., China, and Mexico, and has been featured on numerous CD recordings. A graduate of the McGill University B.Mus. and M.Mus programs in Jazz Performance, Jim has been the Guitar Section Head at Grant MacEwan University in Edmonton since 2007.



### John Jasavala

Jehanbakhsh (John) Jasavala has an active life as a performer, teacher, clinician and adjudicator. He has held the position of Principal Trombone with both the Windsor and Thunder Bay Symphony Orchestras, and has performed as a freelance musician with several orchestras in Ontario and Michigan, including Orchestra London, and The Detroit Symphony Orchestra. Jehanbakhsh is the founding member and leader of The Umbrella Brass Quintet and is currently a lecturer, chamber ensembles coach and instructor of trombone at the University of Western Ontario and the University of Toronto.



### Jeff Johnson

Jeff Johnson was educated at the University of Manitoba where he completed degrees in both Music and Education. He has been actively involved in music education for the past 16 years, working as an educator, clinician, coordinator, guest conductor and adjudicator, as well as spending many years on the Jazz Faculty at International Music Camp. He was the founder and Coordinator of the Manitoba Band Association Selkirk Summer Band Workshop and continues to perform as both a freelance musician, guest artist and lead trumpet player for both the Winnipeg Jazz Orchestra and the Ron Paley Big Band.

### Aldo Mazza

With an extensive 30-year touring and recording career, Aldo Mazza is an internationally recognized drummer-percussionist, recording artist, clinician and educator, as well as a composer, record producer, publisher and editor. Aldo has performed four World Tours on major concert stages and has made many radio and television appearances. Aldo has recorded over 100 CDs with artists such as Celine Dion, Aldo Nova, James Brown and Chris DeBurgh, to name a few. He has performed with major symphony orchestras and at jazz festivals worldwide and is a Master clinician in Classical Percussion, World Music & Drumset. Aldo is the Founder and Artistic Director of KoSA Communications and the KoSA International Percussion Workshops and Festivals, and is the Co-founder & Artistic Director of the KoSA Cuba Workshop and Festival. ### Chris McLaughlin

Chris McLaughlin is a veteran vocal jazz educator and clinician from St. Catharines. Ontario. ### Bob Rebagliati

For over 30 years, in the North Vancouver School District, Bob Rebagliati has directed many award winning junior and senior high school ensembles in both concert band and jazz. As a music festival adjudicator and workshop leader, he has travelled throughout Canada and has been a director and clinician of numerous honour bands and jazz groups and at summer music camps. Over the years, Bob has also arranged and composed music for jazz and concert bands and has written curriculum in the areas of rhythm section and concert band percussion. His groups have been honoured with a long list of awards and recognition; throughout his career Bob has been appreciated for his dedication and insistence on excellence. He is now retired from teaching and works as a freelance music educator, pianist and percussionist/drummer.



### Stuart Sladden

Stuart Sladden has been teaching and performing in the Toronto area since 1996. During his high school years he studied both trumpet and voice, and it was his affinity for vocal jazz music that eventually led him to pursue a post-secondary education in vocal jazz performance. He studied for a year at Humber College and transferred to the University of Toronto where he graduated with his B. Music in Performance in 2002. Stuart is currently working as the Music Director and Organist for Eden United Church in Mississauga, the Music Director of Oasis Vocal Jazz Ensemble, and the Assistant Conductor of Pax Christi Chorale, and is a member of the Pax Christi Chamber Choir. Along with choral work and teaching, Stuart is a composer and arranger and has taken up English Handbells in his spare time. He will return to school in the fall to start graduate work in Choral Conducting.



Bassist and composer Ashley Summers has collected musical experiences and opportunities that reach well beyond her years, and her talents have brought her to stages all over the world. As a member of IAJE's Sisters In Jazz Quintet in 2003, she performed at the Mary Lou Williams Women In Jazz Festival in Washington, DC, as well as at legendary festivals in France, The Netherlands and Italy. More recently, Ashley has been busy touring in the US, playing in many celebrated clubs. Aside from keeping a busy performance schedule, Ashley is also an in-demand educator. 


### Rod Wiedman
