



#### Memo Acevedo – percussion

Memo Acevedo is a drummer/percussionist from Colombia residing in New York City who specializes in Colombian, Brazilian Cuban Percussion and Latin Jazz. He is the co-author of Afro-Caribbean and Brazilian Drumming by NYC's Drummer's Collective where he's been teaching since 1996. He's credited as the pioneer and educator of Cuban, Brazilian and Latin Jazz in Canada during the many years he lived there. Awards include a National "Best AD Award" for his Rubbermaid Commercial, a JUNO Award in the World Music category, two "Percussionist of the Year" awards by The Jazz Report Magazine, the KoSA Lifetime Achievement Award and most recently the PAS President's Industry Award in November 2011. Memo appears with the support of Sabian, Evans and Promark.

#### Andrea Calderwood – vocals

Andrea began to sing jazz at age 12, influenced by her bass playing father. While in junior college, she sang in the downbeat award winning "Singcopation" under the direction of Bruce Rogers, and eventually went on to sing with Doc Severson, the Boston Pops, John Williams, and the L.A. Philharmonic. Andrea has won several awards, including the Friends of Jazz award, the Harriet Genung award, The Plotkins vocal scholarship, and outstanding vocal soloist in the Monterey "Next Generation" Jazz Festival. Andrea received her bachelor's degree in music from California State University Fullerton, and did her masters studies at Cal State Long Beach. Andrea is also an accomplished arranger and teacher. She is the recipient of a 2010 "Downbeat Award" for jazz arranging at the graduate level. Andrea is currently working on her debut album and teaching at Musicians Institute in Hollywood, CA.

### Corey Christiansen - quitar

Widely heralded as a gifted young player with a passionate sound, jazzguitarist Corey Christiansen took up the instrument at the age of five. Corey earned a bachelor's degree in music from Utah State and a master's degree in jazz performance from the University of South Florida. Corey has played numerous jazz festivals throughout North America and Europe and has played or recorded with an impressive roster of artists. He served as senior editor for Mel Bay Publications from 2000 to 2007 and has written or co-written more than 70 books for the company. As well as maintaining an active international performance and touring schedule, he currently is the Director of Curriculum at The Music School in American Fork, UT. ### Jim Culbertson - trumpet

For 39 years Jim Culbertson was a high school band director in Decatur, IL, and the driving force in the Decatur West End music program. He has also been musical director and conductor of the Decatur Municipal Band for the past 33 years. In addition, he was the founder, leader and lead trumpet player for the Decatur Big Band and the Moonlight Serenade Dance Orchestra. Jim's high school jazz band, Mac Jazz, has made 24 recordings and has earned 37 Downbeat Magazine Student Music Awards in an assortment of categories, garnering the top spot as the best high school jazz band in the U.S. four times. Throughout his teaching career, Jim has also played lead trumpet for many national musical acts. He has served as president/ vice-president of various Music Educators Associations throughout his career and has served as a national clinician and conductor for many music festivals and conferences throughout the US.

#### Trist Curless - vocals

Trist Ethan Curless is a member and co-founder of the vocal group, m-pact. Trist has written/arranged/produced songs for this group as well as others. He most recently produced an album for the Bay-Area vocal group Clockwork. Before m-pact, Trist majored in Music Education at the University of Northern Colorado. When not on tour, he works as a live audio engineer and makes time to teach private voice, work with vocal groups, and participate as a clinician and adjudicator in clinics and festivals worldwide.


#### Gordon Foote - saxophone

Gordon Foote is currently an Associate Professor in the Jazz Studies Program at the Schulich School of Music of McGill University, in Montreal, Quebec. Gordon is one of the pioneers of jazz education in Canada, being instrumental in the development and implementation of the first undergraduate and graduate university jazz studies programs in the country. Professor Foote is the coordinator of the McGill Jazz Orchestras, and directs McGill Jazz Orchestra I. As a saxophonist and clinician for Conn-Selmer, Gordon has performed in Canada, Europe and the United States. Gordon has served as the Quebec representative to the IAJE, the Director of Education for IAJE Canada and as President of Jazz Canada. His studies at the University of Minnesota and the University of North Texas, combined with 36 years of performing and teaching experience, leave him as probably the most requested adjudicator, conductor, clinician and jazz educator/performer in Canada. He has co-authored *The Jazz Educators Handbook* with Doug Beach, a jazz piano book with Matt Harris entitled *The Chord Voicing Handbook*, and with Mike Carubia, *Effective Etudes For Jazz*. Jeff is sponsored in part by Yamaha Music Canada.

### Greg Jasperse – vocals

Greg Jasperse is a world-renowned composer and arranger currently living in Los Angeles, CA. He is sought after internationally as a clinician, adjudicator and guest conductor. A graduate of University of Miami and Western Michigan University, Greg is currently adjunct professor of music at Pasadena City College as well as a regular staff member at many summer music camps including the New York Voices Vocal Jazz Camp and the Steve Zegree Vocal Jazz Camp. He also belongs to two professional vocal groups: Sixth Wave and Vertical Voices. His voice can be heard on numerous movie soundtracks including *Star Trek*, *National Treasure 2*, *SALT*, *The Last Airbender* and *Real Steel*. Greg has also released two solo piano CDs. *Tournesol* is a collection of contemporary jazz originals and *Crossings* is a collection of improvised hymn meditations.

#### Sammy K – percussion

Grammy-nominated musician Sammy K began his professional career at the age of 13 in Michigan. Sammy has been seen all over the country as a clinician and/or performer. He works with school districts around the U.S. and Canada as a guest instructor for their Jazz and Rock Bands, and has been the Drum Line Instructor for multiple award winning high school programs. Currently based in Los Angeles, Sammy K has performed or recorded with a list of artists. He has appeared on the Emmy Award winning Wayne Brady Show, Ally McBeal with KC and the Sunshine Band and Josh Groban, Unsung Heros on CMT and in the film The Fast and the Furious. Sammy appears with the support of Zildjian.

#### Jeff Kidwell - trombone

Jeff Kidwell is an instructor with the University of Central Oklahoma's School of Music in Edmond. His duties include Trombone Instructor, Director of Jazz Ensembles, Assistant Director of Jazz Studies, Assistant Director of Jazz Lab Operations and Instrumental Music Education Coordinator. Mr. Kidwell is a highly sought after musician/clinician who has performed with the likes of Pete Fountain, Branford Marsalis, Randy Brecker, Clark Terry, Phil Woods, Amy Grant, Aretha Franklin, The Temptations, The Four Tops and many others. He also performs with the Oklahoma City Philharmonic Orchestra, the Oklahoma City Jazz Orchestra and the Civilized Tribe Dixieland band. 

### Jim MacKay – educator

A 35-year veteran of teaching music and directing bands in both Canada and the United States, Jim continues to remain active working as an adjudicator, quest conductor and clinician throughout Canada and the U.S. Jim studied at the University of Iowa, the University of Northern Colorado and the University of South Dakota where he received his Masters Degrees in Music and Music Education. Jim retired from teaching after 24 years at Silver Heights Collegiate. Jim now resides at Matlock, Manitoba, where he is active as the conductor of the local community choir in Gimli.

#### Jodi Proznick – bass

Jodi Proznick is an award winning bassist from South Surrey, B.C., who has shared the stage with some of the biggest stars in jazz. She was the Bassist of the Year at the 2008 and 2009 National Jazz Awards and her group, the Jodi Proznick Quartet, was awarded the Acoustic Group of the Year. Proznick has won numerous awards and, since moving back to Vancouver from Montreal in 2000, Jodi has become a top call bassist. She has played with a long list of international jazz stars and has been featured on dozens of recordings, radio and television shows. In 1998, Jodi obtained her B.Mus. from McGill University and in 2006, her M.Ed. from Simon Fraser University. She is on faculty at Kwantlen Polytechnic University and Capilano University. She in demand as an adjudicator and clinician at festivals, conferences and workshops across Canada.

#### Fred Stride – educator

Fred Stride has been an active professional musician in Vancouver for more than 30 years. A graduate of the UBC School of Music. Fred also studied in Los Angeles with Dick Grove. As a trumpet player Fred performed a wide range of gigs including concerts and shows with local and visiting entertainers and recording for both radio and television, but it is his writing for which he has become best known. Fred has now set aside his trumpet and has been concentrating on composition. Besides writing for his own big band, The Fred Stride Jazz Orchestra, Fred has received numerous commissions from many performers and ensembles over the years. Fred's jazz compositions have been played and recorded around the world. Besides his busy schedule as a composer and arranger, Fred is also active as a quest conductor, teacher, clinician and adjudicator. He has been the leader of several ensembles in Vancouver over the years, most recently the Fred Stride Jazz Orchestra, which has been recorded and broadcast by CBC radio. Fred's compositions, recordings, and bands have received numerous awards and excellent reviews.

#### Tina Thielen-Gaffey – vocals


Dr. Tina Thielen-Gaffey is the Assistant Director of Choral Activities at the University of Minnesota-Duluth where she conducts Concert Chorale, two Vocal Jazz Ensembles (Lake Effect and Chill Factor), teaches elementary music, applied voice and graduate courses in voice, conducting, and vocal jazz seminars. Dr. Thielen-Gaffey regularly conducts choir festivals in the U.S. and Canada and is an active clinician. She has also lectured nationally and internationally in the area of vocal jazz, American spirituals, and gospel music. As a vocalist, she regularly sings with jazz combos in the Duluth area, is the cantor Duluth's Concordia Lutheran Church, codirects and sings in the Twin Ports Choral Project and sings for a variety of community events.

Rod Wiedman was born and raised in Minnesota where he began his music career playing trumpet and french horn. He continued his music education at Moorhead State University in Moorhead, Minnesota, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Instrumental Music. His groups have won many prestigious provincial, national and international awards. Over the past several years, Mr. Wiedman has served as clinician, educator, conductor and adjudicator for many festivals and honour bands throughout western Canada.

Blaine Workman has been a music educator for the past 32 years. He received his Bachelor of Music degree from Queen's University in 1976 and his Bachelor of Education from Queen's in 1978. 


Two \$150 scholarships to the University of Manitoba Summer Jazz Camp will be awarded to outstanding vocalists, as selected by the adjudicators.
