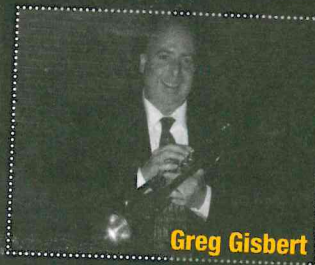

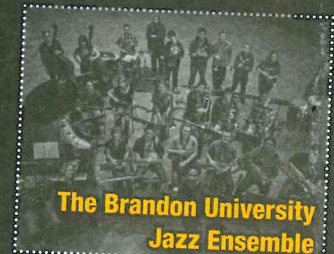

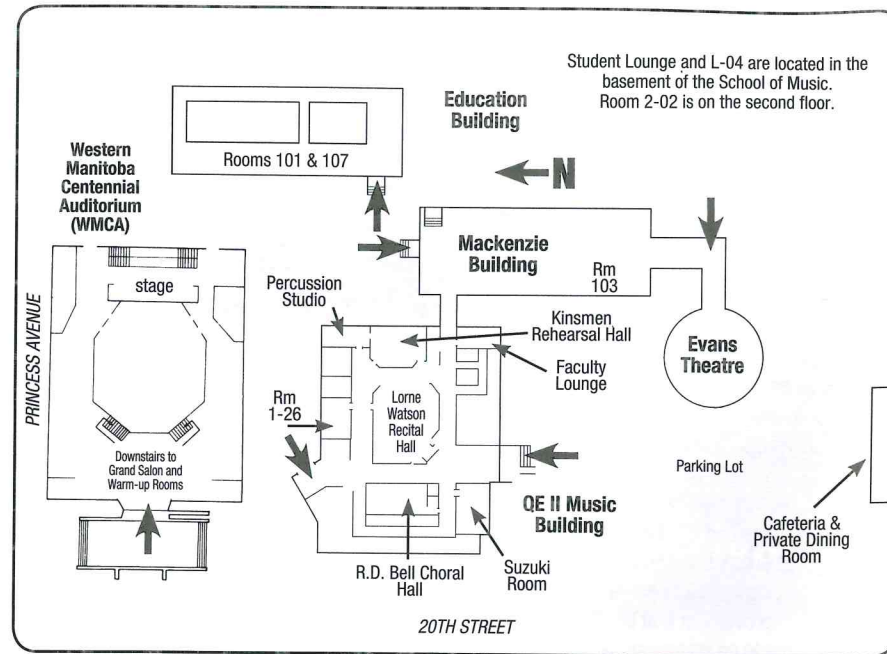
I would like to add my thanks to Robin for the opportunity he is providing our school.

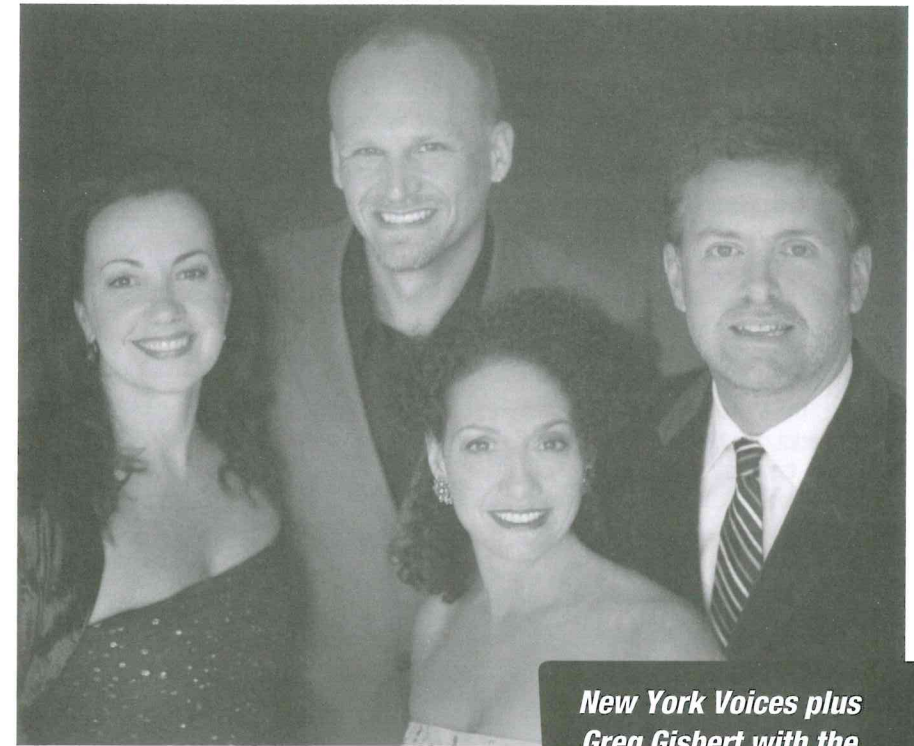

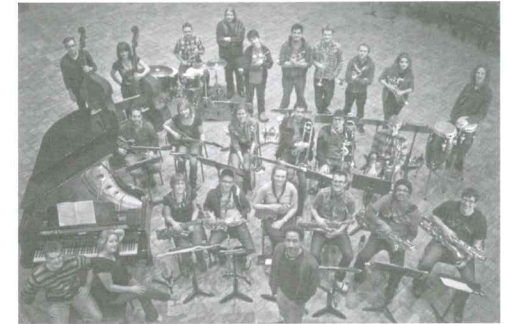

The Brandon University Jazz band is outright one of the best, most interesting, and eclectic big bands on the college scene. This group features some of the most talented students at BU, and performs a repertoire that ranges from Duke Ellington and Count Basie to African music from Fela Kuti. Memo Acevedo

Memo Acevedo – percussion

Memo Acevedo is a drummer/percussionist from Colombia residing in New York City who specializes in Colombian, Brazilian Cuban Percussion and Latin Jazz. He is the co-author of *Afro-Caribbean and Brazilian Drumming* by NYC's Drummer's Collective where he's been teaching since 1996. He's credited as the pioneer and educator of Cuban, Brazilian and Latin Jazz in Canada during the many years he lived there. Awards include a National "Best AD Award" for his Rubbermaid Commercial, a JUNO Award in the World Music category, two "Percussionist of the Year" awards by *The Jazz Report Magazine*, the KoSA Lifetime Achievement Award and most recently the PAS President's Industry Award in November 2011. Andrea Calderwood – vocals

Andrea began to sing jazz at age 12, influenced by her bass playing father. While in junior college, she sang in the downbeat award winning "Singcopation" under the direction of Bruce Rogers, and eventually went on to sing with Doc Severson, the Boston Pops, John Williams, and the L.A. Philharmonic. Andrea has won several awards, including the Friends of Jazz award, the Harriet Genung award, The Plotkins vocal scholarship, and outstanding vocal soloist in the Monterey "Next Generation" Jazz Festival. Andrea received her bachelor's degree in music from California State University Fullerton, and did her masters studies at Cal State Long Beach. Andrea is also an accomplished arranger and teacher. She is the recipient of a 2010 "Downbeat Award" for jazz arranging at the graduate level. Andrea is currently working on her debut album and teaching at Musicians Institute in Hollywood, CA.

Corey Christiansen - guitar

Widely heralded as a gifted young player with a passionate sound, jazz-guitarist Corey Christiansen took up the instrument at the age of five. Corey earned a bachelor's degree in music from Utah State and a master's degree in jazz performance from the University of South Florida. Corey has played numerous jazz festivals throughout North America and Europe and has played or recorded with an impressive roster of artists. He served as senior editor for Mel Bay Publications from 2000 to 2007 and has written or co-written more than 70 books for the company. As well as maintaining an active international performance and touring schedule, he currently is the Director of Curriculum at The Music School in American Fork, UT. Jim Culbertson – trumpet

For 39 years Jim Culbertson was a high school band director in Decatur, IL, and the driving force in the Decatur West End music program. He has also been musical director and conductor of the Decatur Municipal Band for the past 33 years. In addition, he was the founder, leader and lead trumpet player for the Decatur Big Band and the Moonlight Serenade Dance Orchestra. Jim's high school jazz band, Mac Jazz, has made 24 recordings and has earned 37 *Downbeat Magazine* Student Music Awards in an assortment of categories, garnering the top spot as the best high school jazz band in the U.S. four times. Throughout his teaching career, Jim has also played lead trumpet for many national musical acts. He has served as president/vice-president of various Music Educators Associations throughout his career and has served as a national clinician and conductor for many music festivals and conferences throughout the US.

Trist Ethan Curless is a member and co-founder of the vocal group, m-pact. Trist has written/arranged/produced songs for this group as well as others. He most recently produced an album for the Bay-Area vocal group Clockwork. Before m-pact, Trist majored in Music Education at the University of Northern Colorado. When not on tour, he works as a live audio engineer and makes time to teach private voice, work with vocal groups, and participate as a clinician and adjudicator in clinics and festivals worldwide.

Gordon Foote – saxophone

Gordon Foote is currently an Associate Professor in the Jazz Studies Program at the Schulich School of Music of McGill University, in Montreal, Quebec. Gordon is one of the pioneers of jazz education in Canada, being instrumental in the development and implementation of the first undergraduate and graduate university jazz studies programs in the country. Professor Foote is the coordinator of the McGill Jazz Orchestras, and directs McGill Jazz Orchestra I. As a saxophonist and clinician for Conn-Selmer, Gordon has performed in Canada, Europe and the United States. Gordon has served as the Quebec representative to the IAJE, the Director of Education for IAJE Canada and as President of Jazz Canada. His studies at the University of Minnesota and the University of North Texas, combined with 36 years of performing and teaching experience, leave him as probably the most requested adjudicator, conductor, clinician and jazz educator/performer in Canada. He has co-authored *The Jazz Educators Handbook* with Doug Beach, a jazz piano book with Matt Harris entitled *The Chord Voicing Handbook*, and with Mike Carubia, *Effective Etudes For Jazz*. Greg Jasperse – vocals

Greg Jasperse is a world-renowned composer and arranger currently living in Los Angeles, CA. He is sought after internationally as a clinician, adjudicator and guest conductor. A graduate of University of Miami and Western Michigan University, Greg is currently adjunct professor of music at Pasadena City College as well as a regular staff member at many summer music camps including the New York Voices Vocal Jazz Camp and the Steve Zegree Vocal Jazz Camp. 

A 35-year veteran of teaching music and directing bands in both Canada and the United States, Jim continues to remain active working as an adjudicator, guest conductor and clinician throughout Canada and the U.S. Jim studied at the University of Iowa, the University of Northern Colorado and the University of South Dakota where he received his Masters Degrees in Music and Music Education. Jodi Proznick – bass

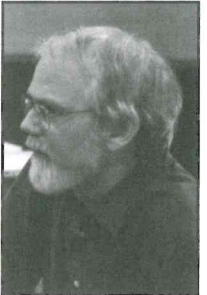

In 1998, Jodi obtained her B.Mus. from McGill University and in 2006, her M.Ed. from Simon Fraser University. She is on faculty at Kwantlen Polytechnic University and Capilano University. She is in demand as an adjudicator and clinician at festivals, conferences and workshops across Canada.

Fred Stride has been an active professional musician in Vancouver for more than 30 years. A graduate of the UBC School of Music, Fred also studied in Los Angeles with Dick Grove. Fred has now set aside his trumpet and has been concentrating on composition. Fred's jazz compositions have been played and recorded around the world. Besides his busy schedule as a composer and arranger, Fred is also active as a guest conductor, teacher, clinician and adjudicator. He has been the leader of several ensembles in Vancouver over the years, most recently the Fred Stride Jazz Orchestra, which has been recorded and broadcast by CBC radio. Fred's compositions, recordings, and bands have received numerous awards and excellent reviews.



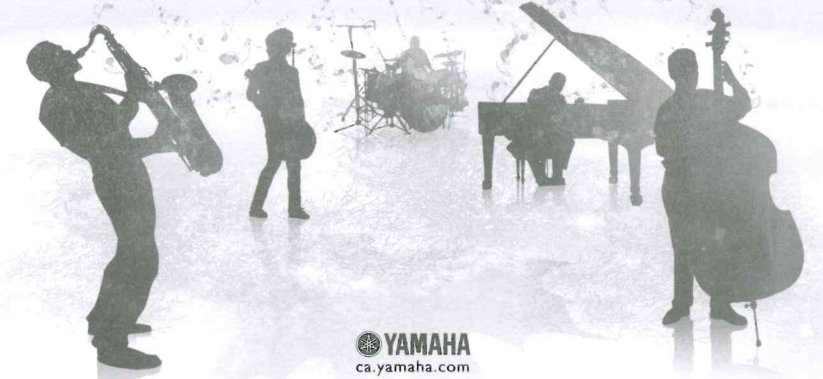
