



Luis Bonilla

The California-raised, Costa Rican trombonist, composer and arranger has sought out, taken in and mastered an incredible array of musical styles. His success as a sideman with such greats as McCoy Tyner, Dizzy Gillespie, Lester Bowie, Tom Harrell, Freddie Hubbard, Astrud Gilberto, Willie Colon and Toshiko Akiyoshi attests not only to the skill and variety of Bonilla's talent, but also to a mind restlessly committed to exploring some of the most complex and demanding music of our time.

He has worked as a studio musician with Tony Bennett, Marc Anthony, La India and Mary J. Blige and understands and exploits the liveliness of pop as well as the rhythmic sway and punch of Latin Jazz. Currently a member of the Vanguard Jazz Orchestra, the Afro-Latin Jazz Orchestra and Dave Douglas & Brass Ecstasy, Bonilla is one of those rare artists whose work is always expanding, taking in more and more while remaining singular and focused: "Bonilla may be a trombonist used to handling that big long sliding thing, but when it comes to execution of his ideas, he lets nothing slide." Ronald Carter – educator

Ronald Carter is currently the Professor of Music at Northern Illinois University and serves as the Director of the Jazz Studies Program and director the NIU Jazz Ensemble. Carter also serves as Lead Artist for Jazz At Lincoln Center Band Director Academy, and Education Consultant for the Essentially Ellington Program. Carter has facilitated workshops as quest conductor. artist, clinician, and adjudicator for colleges and universities all over the USA and around the world. Carter spent over 18 years in the St. Louis Metropolitan area as both an educator and as a professional musician, and has won many honours and awards over the years. Jeremy Fox – piano, composer

Jeremy Fox earned his B.M. degree in Piano and Jazz Studies from Western Michigan University. He later received his M.M. degree in Studio Jazz Writing from the University of Miami. Jeremy was a professor at The School for Music Vocations for eight years, and currently lives in Miami, having recently earned his Doctorate in Jazz Composition. He is active as a clinician, and has served as guest conductor throughout the United States and Canada. Jeremy has received ten awards from *Downbeat* magazine, and his charts have been published with many publishing companies.

Alastair Kav – trombone

Alastair Kay, trombonist, arranger, composer, clinician, and Head of Brass at Humber College, is well known as an extremely versatile and virtuosic musician. His extensive performance experience includes working with Rob McConnell's Boss Brass, Ella Fitzgerald, Frank Sinatra, Aretha Franklin, Barbra Steisand, Slide Hampton, True North Brass, John MacLeod's big band, Phil Dwyer, Roberto Occhipinti, Gino Vannelli, Hilario Duran, and as a soloist with many leading orchestras and bands. Al has more than 30 years of musical theatre experience in Toronto and has recorded hundreds of television soundtracks, jingles, and feature films. Al is a Yamaha artist, and has given many trombone master classes and concerts throughout the world. He has been to Japan, co-designing the YSL 697Z trombone and the Al Kay artist mouthpieces which are available worldwide, receiving rave reviews.

Steve Koven – piano, composer

Steve Koven was born in Toronto and has been a professional musician since earning a BFA in Contemporary Improvisation from York University in 1987. In addition to performing worldwide with his trio, Koven plays solo piano concerts throughout North America, Europe, and the Caribbean, When not on tour or in the studio, Steve composes music for film and television and conducts master classes and workshops worldwide. Steve has been on staff at York University since 2003, where he teaches Contemporary Improvisation and Jazz Piano in the Faculty of Music. In 2012 Steve received a Masters Degree in Composition from York University.

Jim MacKay - educator, conductor

A 35-year veteran of teaching music and directing bands in both Canada and the United States. Jim continues to remain active working as an adjudicator, guest conductor and clinician throughout Canada and the U.S. Jim studied at the University of Iowa, the University of Northern Colorado and the University of South Dakota where he received his Masters Degrees in Music and Music Education. Jim retired from teaching after 24 years at Silver Heights Collegiate. Jim now resides at Matlock, Manitoba, where he is active as the conductor of the local community choir in Gimli.

Jon McCaslin - drums

Jon McCaslin completed his Masters in Jazz Studies at McGill University and in 2012 released his album, Sunalta, which was later nominated for the Western Canadian Music Awards in the "Best Jazz Recording" category. McCaslin is a Doctoral Candidate through the University of Toronto and is completing his dissertation on the conceptualization of contemporary melodic jazz drumming. Since 2009 he has authored Four on the Floor, one of the world's most recognized online jazz drumming blogs. He is currently based in Calgary where he maintains a busy performing and teaching schedule across Canada.

Chris McLaughlin – vocals

Chris McLaughlin is one of the vocal jazz pioneers in Canada. Groups under Chris's direction have performed at the National Arts Centre, on CBC-Radio, with the Niagara Symphony Orchestra, and as the opening act for five-time Grammy nominee, singer Nnenna Freelon. His high school vocal jazz ensembles were invited on two occasions to perform at the Annual Conference of the International Association for Jazz Education. His latest ensemble. Hamilton All Star Vocal Jazz, was selected to perform at the 2013 JEN conference in Atlanta, Georgia. Chris has appeared as a Clinician in Canada and the US, as well as at several previous Brandon Jazz Festivals. He believes the Brandon festival is one of the best festivals in North America for many educational reasons, and is thrilled to have been invited back this year.

Greg McLean - educator

Greg McLean most recently served as Director of Bands at the University of Regina following 35 years as a high school instrumental music director. McLean received his Bachelor of Music degree from Brandon University. His graduate work includes a Graduate Diploma in conducting and wind repertoire from the University of Calgary, and a Master of Music degree in conducting from the University of Manitoba. He is a full-time faculty member of the Prairieland Summer Jazz Camp in Regina and is also the orchestra director for the Swift Current Oratorio Choir.



In addition to teaching private voice lessons, doing workshops, and adjudicating, Marcia McLean is the artistic director of the Swift Current Oratorio Choir and the adult chamber choir, Prairie Spirit. McLean was the founding director of the Swift Current Children's Choir and conducted the choir for 12 years. Marcia is currently President of the Saskatchewan Choral Federation and serves on the board of the Swift Current Music Festival. In 2004 McLean was awarded the Pro Musica Award by the Saskatchewan Choral Federation for outstanding service in the choral community. Marcia received her Bachelor of Music at Brandon University.


Josh Skinner - bass, educator
